## House Concurrent Resolution 6007

Introduced by: Representative Duba

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Supporting students and other persons afflicted by 2 epilepsy and raising awareness of epilepsy in South Dakota. 3 WHEREAS, epilepsy is a disease characterized by an enduring predisposition to generate 4 epileptic seizures and by the neurobiological, cognitive, psychological, and social 5 consequences of this condition; and 6 WHEREAS, a seizure is an event, and epilepsy is the disease involving recurrent 7 unprovoked seizures that is the fourth most common neurological disorder and affects people 8 of all ages; and 9 WHEREAS, epilepsy is a spectrum condition with a wide range of seizure types and control 10 varying from person-to-person; and 11 WHEREAS, one in twenty-six people will be diagnosed with epilepsy at some point in life 12 and one in ten people will suffer a seizure at some point in life; and WHEREAS, historical treatment of persons living with epilepsy has led to false, unsafe 13 understandings of the disease and a significant underfunding of research when compared to 14 other diseases; and 15 16 WHEREAS, 3.4 million people in the United States battle epilepsy every day, including 17 over nine thousand people in South Dakota, and over one thousand children who are among 18 the most vulnerable members of our state; and 19 WHEREAS, creating awareness of epilepsy will promote much-needed fundraising, seizure

safety, and first aid knowledge to ensure the safety of our students and other citizens living

with epilepsy; and

- 5 <u>Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the Legislature</u>
- 6 supports the people of South Dakota afflicted by epilepsy and urges school boards and
- 7 administrators, teachers, support staff, parents, and the public at large to increase awareness
- 8 of the disease for the better protection of this state's most vulnerable citizens.
