House Concurrent Resolution 6010

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Supporting the creation of an early education 2 advisory council. 3 WHEREAS, society benefits from a well-educated citizenry; and 4 WHEREAS, research demonstrates that children who participate in high-quality early 5 education programs have better higher-order thinking and attention skills, as well as better executive functions, such as self-control, decision-making skill and the ability to connect 6 7 social, emotional, and cognitive processes; and 8 WHEREAS, well-regarded studies have shown that high-quality early education programs both increase the likelihood that children will gain higher levels of cognitive and social skills 9 10 and become successful students and productive citizens and reduce the chances that they will drop out of high school, become dependent on welfare, or be incarcerated; and 11 12 WHEREAS, studies indicate that children exposed to high-quality early education programs have better oral literacy, have better reading, writing, and mathematics abilities, require 13 14 fewer remedial services, experience less grade retention, and have a higher likelihood of 15 economic productivity and social stability in adulthood; and 16 WHEREAS, in order to address the needs of all children so they can meet high standards 17 and in order to close the objectionably large achievement gap between advantaged and 18 disadvantaged students, this state must focus its attention on issues related to early education

WHEREAS, high quality childcare services remain unaffordable for most working families

- 7 <u>educational opportunities for all students across this state.</u>
