L	A CONCURRENT	RESOLUTION,	Supporting	the Recovering	, America's	Wildlife	Act.

2	WHEREAS, Congress passed the Pittman-Robertson, Dingell-Johnson and Wallop-Breaux					
3	Acts to establish funds financed by hunters, recreational shooters, anglers, and boaters to					
4	support wildlife and sportfish recovery and management; and					
5	WHEREAS, South Dakota's residents and visitors have a long tradition of hunting, fishing					
6	and trapping and also enjoy watching wildlife around their homes and during trips away from					
7	home; and					
8	WHEREAS, South Dakota's residents and visitors contribute more than one billion dollars					
9	in direct spending in the state annually on outdoor recreation activities; and					
10	WHEREAS, South Dakota's tourism industry attracted 14.5 million visitors in 2019, and					
11	South Dakota's natural landscapes and wildlife are critical for attracting visitors; and					
12	WHEREAS, a dedicated and sustainable funding mechanism is needed for many species of					
13	fish and wildlife that are not pursued by hunters, trappers, or anglers; and					
14	WHEREAS, the South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks has the primary					
15	statutory responsibility for the management of fish and wildlife in the state; and					
16	WITEDEAC Courth Delicateds Wildlife Action Dlan addresses the moods of the stated fish and					
16	WHEREAS, South Dakota's Wildlife Action Plan addresses the needs of the state's fish and					
17	wildlife species, including species of greatest conservation need; and					
18	WHEREAS, limited financial resources are available to fully implement the state's Wildlife					
10	whichers, inniced financial resources are available to fully implement the state's wilding					

Action Plan to help prevent future threatened and endangered species listings and provide for

the needs of all species and key habitats; and

WHEREAS, the Blue Ribbon Panel on Sustaining America's Diverse Fish and Wildlife
Resources, is composed of 26 business and conservation leaders, recommended that a new
funding mechanism be established for state fish and wildlife conservation and management

- 4 for current and future generations; and
- 5 <u>WHEREAS</u>, the Blue Ribbon Panel recommended that Congress dedicate up to \$1.3 billion
- 6 <u>annually to the Wildlife Conservation and Restoration Subaccount of the Pittman-Robertson</u>
- 7 Wildlife Restoration Act to diversify the funding and management of all fish and wildlife; and
- 8 WHEREAS, funding is also needed to assist South Dakota tribal governments with fish and
- 9 wildlife conservation and management; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Recovering America's Wildlife Act would fulfill the Blue Ribbon Panel's
- 11 recommendation by making funds available to address the needs of species of greatest
- conservation need as identified in state wildlife action plans:
- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Ninety-Fifth
- 14 <u>Legislature of the State of South Dakota</u>, the Senate concurring therein, that the South Dakota
- 15 <u>Legislature supports the Recovering America's Wildlife Act, which will dedicate \$1.3 billion</u>
- 16 annually to the Wildlife Conservation and Restoration Subaccount of the Pittman-Robertson
- 17 Act to help address the needs of all fish and wildlife and will also dedicate \$98 million annually
- 18 to assist with tribal fish and wildlife management needs in the U.S.; and
- 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the South Dakota Legislature supports the Alliance for
- 20 America's Fish and Wildlife's campaign to secure passage of the Recovering America's Wildlife
- 21 Act and urges Governor Noem, Representative Johnson, Senator Rounds, and Senator Thune
- 22 to support this effort; and
- 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the South Dakota Legislature, acknowledges its support
- 24 for state policy and legislation to broaden dedicated funding mechanisms for wildlife
- 25 conservation, Wildlife Action Plan implementation, enhanced tribal fish and wildlife
- 26 <u>management</u>, and aid in providing the required match when new dedicated federal funding is
- 27 secured.
