## House Bill 1136

AMENDMENT 1136I FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

1	An Act to provide for the licensure and regulation of practitioners of acupuncture
2	and Oriental medicine and to establish the <b>Acupuncture Licensing Board and</b>
3	acupuncture regulation fund.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

5 **Section 1.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

6	3	6-39-1. Definitions.
7		Terms used in this Act mean:
8	<u>(1)</u>	"Acupressure," the applications of pressure to acupuncture points;
9	<u>(2)</u>	"Acupuncture needle," a sterile single-use needle designed exclusively for
10		acupuncture purposes with a solid core and a tapered point, being constructed of
11		stainless steel, gold, silver, or other materials approved by the board with or
12		without the use of electrical stimulation;
13	<u>(3)</u>	"Acupuncture points," specific anatomical locations used in the practice of
14		acupuncture;
15	<u>(4)</u>	"Asian Bodywork Therapy," pressure or manipulation of the body, primarily with
16		the hands, along meridians or acupuncture points; external application of medicinal
17		plants or food; and exercise suggestions;
18	<u>(5)</u>	"Board," the Acupuncture Licensing Board established in § 36-39-2;
19	<u>(6)</u>	"Electrical stimulation," a method of stimulating acupuncture points with an
20		electrical current that may be performed by attaching a device to an acupuncture
21		needle or may be performed transcutaneously without penetrating the skin;
22	<u>(7)</u>	"Licensed acupuncturist," any person licensed to practice acupuncture pursuant to
23		this chapter;
24	<u>(8)</u>	"NCCAOM," the National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental
25		Medicine, a not-for-profit corporation granting certification to a person who has
26		met the standards of competence established for either NCCAOM certification in

1 acupuncture or NCCAOM certification in Oriental medicine and is current with the 2 required continuing education; 3 "Oriental dietary and lifestyle therapy," utilizing herbs, foods, food concentrated, (9) food supplements, or dietary supplements, while advising a patient regarding 4 5 lifestyle modifications according to the principles of Oriental medicine; "Oriental medicine," a system of healing arts using well-established Oriental 6 (10) 7 medical therapies and procedures for the purpose of normalizing physiological functions including pain control; the promotion, maintenance and restoration of 8 9 health and well-being; strengthening the body; and improving energy balance. Treatment of the patient is achieved through specialized methods, diagnosing 10 imbalances within the body and treating the body with acupuncture and other 11 12 related Oriental medicine therapies and techniques. 13 **Section 2.** That a NEW SECTION be added: 36-39-2. Board--Membership--Terms of service--Duties--Meetings. 14 15 There is hereby established the Acupuncture Licensing Board within the Department of Health. The board shall submit records, information, and reports in the 16 form and as required by the secretary of health. The board shall report at least annually 17 18 to the Department of Health. 19 The board consists of five members appointed by the Governor. Three members shall be licensed acupuncturists, one member shall be a licensed health care professional 20 21 certified to perform acupuncture, and one member shall represent the consumer. Each 22 member shall serve a three-year term and may serve no more than three consecutive 23 three-year terms. The board shall meet up to twice a year to: 24 determine Determine and finalize any refusal to grant a license or cancellation, (1)25 revocation, or suspension of a license; and 26 Conduct any business that may properly come before the board. (2) 27 Board members shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for per 28 diem and travel for up to two meetings per year. 29 At the expiration of a term, or if a vacancy occurs, the Governor shall appoint a 30 new board member. The Governor may stagger the terms to enable the board to have 31 different terms expire each year. The Governor may remove any member from the board 32 for neglect of any duty required by law or for incompetency or unprofessional or 33 dishonorable conduct.

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1	Section 3. That a NEW SECTION be added:
2	36-39-3. Officers of the boardBond of secretary-treasurer.
3	The board shall organize annually by electing a president, vice-president, and
4	secretary-treasurer. The secretary-treasurer of the board may be required to give a bond
5	in any sum and with any conditions as the board directs.
6	Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added:
7	36-39-4. Acupuncture and Oriental medicineDefined.
8	For the purposes of this chapter, acupuncture and Oriental medical practice is a
9	comprehensive system of health care using traditional and modern Oriental medical theory
10	and its unique methods of diagnosis and treatment. The treatment techniques of
11	acupuncture practice include the insertion of acupuncture needles through the skin and
12	the use of other biophysical methods of acupuncture point stimulation, including the use
13	of heat or cold, Asian bodywork therapy techniques, Oriental medicine, electrical
14	stimulation, Oriental dietary and lifestyle therapies, breathing techniques, and exercise
15	based on Oriental medicine principles.
16	Section 5. That a NEW SECTION be added:
17	36-39-5. Acupuncture and Oriental medicinePractices and diagnostic
18	techniques.
19	The practice of acupuncture and Oriental medicine shall include the following
20	practices and diagnostic techniques:
21	(1) Acupuncture, the invasive and noninvasive stimulation of anatomical locations of
22	the body, alone and in combination, including the practice of:
23	(a) Auricular, hand, nose, face, foot or scalp microsystem therapy;
24	(b) Stimulation of points, areas of the body, substances topically applied to the
25	body, and channels by the use of any of the following:
26	(i) Needles, lancets, moxibustion, Qi Gong, thermal methods, heat,
27	cold, herbal preparations, laser, light, sound, vibration, pressure,
28	magnetism, electricity, suction, water, or other devices or means;
29	and and and a second
30	(ii) Manual therapy including massage, acupressure, acupuncture,
31	trigger point dry needling, reflexology, shiatsu, mobilization,

		manipulation, tui-na and acutotement or stimulation that does not
		pierce the skin; <del>_and</del>
		(iii) Injection therapy including the injection of inert substances which
		include injectable saline, vitamin B12, and homeopathics for the
		purpose of the stimulation of acupuncture points, including painful
		trigger points. Injection therapy of any of the substances mentioned
		above is limited by training approved by the National Certification
		Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine and subject to
		federal regulation;

6		Any person who advertises, practices, or attempts to practice acupuncture or who
7	<u>uses</u>	the title, acupuncturist, or any other authorized title as provided in § 36-39-8 to
8	induce	e any person to believe that the person is an acupuncturist without having a valid
9	license	e or renewal certificate is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
10	Section a	<b>8.</b> That a NEW SECTION be added:

12		Only a person licensed or otherwise authorized under this chapter may use the title

15	Section 9	9. That a NEW SECTION be added:
16	36	5-39-9. Requirements for licensureFees.
17		Each applicant for licensure under this chapter shall:
18	<u>(1)</u>	Have successfully completed a graduate level educational program that is offered
19		by an institution of higher education and accredited by a national or regional
20		agency recognized by the United States Department of Education, or another
21		equivalent program approved by the board. In the case of an applicant who has
22		completed education and training outside of the United States, the applicant shall
23		document education and clinical experience that meets the standard established in
24		this section in a manner determined by the board;
25	<u>(2)</u>	Pass a nationally recognized examination approved by the board or have current
26		active status as a Diplomate of Chinese Herbology, Diplomate of Oriental Medicine $_{ au}$
27		or Diplomate of Acupuncture of the NCCAOM;
28	<u>(3)</u>	Pass a nationally recognized ethics course administered or approved by the
29		NCCAOM;
30	<u>(4)</u>	Meet the NCCAOM professional development activity requirements to maintain
31		NCCAOM certification, or equivalent certification. The NCCAOM shall serve as a

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1	Any license not renewed at the end of the sixty-day grace period is expired and
2	the licensee is not eligible to practice within the state. For reinstatement of an expired
3	license within one year of the date of renewal, the board may establish requirements or
4	fees in addition to the fee for license renewal and may require the former licensee to
5	reapply as a new applicant.
6	Section 12. That a NEW SECTION be added:
7	36-39-12. Sterilized equipment required.
8	An acupuncturist shall use sterilized equipment that has been sterilized under
9	standards of the National Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
10	Section 13. That a NEW SECTION be added:
11	36-39-13. Promulgation of rules.
12	The board may promulgate rules pursuant to chapter 1-26 to establish:
13	(1) The application form and other requirements for license application and renewal;
14	(2) The amount of license fees and license renewal fees, neither of which may exceed
15	a maximum of one thousand two-five hundred dollars; and
16	(3) Any additional requirements or conditions for the reinstatement of an expired
17	license.
18	Section 14. That a NEW SECTION be added:
19	36-39-14. ProceedingsRight to appeal.
20	Any proceeding relative to the cancellation, revocation, or suspension of a license
21	shall conform to the procedures set forth in chapter 1-26.
22	Any party who is aggrieved by an act, ruling, or decision of the Acupuncture
23	Licensing Board relating to refusal to grant a license or cancellation, revocation, or
24	suspension of a license may appeal pursuant to chapter 1-26.
25	Section 15. That a NEW SECTION be added:
26	36-39-15. Acupuncture regulation fundEstablishmentContinuous
27	appropriation.
28	There is hereby established in the state treasury the acupuncture regulation fund.
29	All fees received by the board shall be forwarded to the state treasurer for deposit into
30	the acupuncture regulation fund. Any money in the fund is continuously appropriated to

1	the board for the purposes of the operation of the board and the implementation and
2	administration of this chapter. The total expenses incurred by the board may not exceed
3	the total amount of funds collected.
4	Section 16. That a NEW SECTION be added:
5	36-39-16. License signatures and sealDisplay of license.
6	A license to practice acupuncture shall be signed by two members of the board and
7	authenticated by the seal of the board. The license and renewal certificate shall be
8	conspicuously displayed at the office of the practitioner.
9	Section 17. That a NEW SECTION be added:
10	36-39-17. Grounds for license refusal or revocationPromulgation of rules.
11	The board may, in compliance with chapter 1-26, refuse to grant a license to any
12	person otherwise qualified, and may revoke the license of any acupuncturist who is not of
13	good moral character; who solicits professional patronage by agents; who is guilty of
14	unprofessional conduct, incompetency, habitual intoxication, the use of narcotics, fraud,
15	or deception; who is convicted of a felony; or who practices contrary to the provisions of
16	this chapter or the rules of the board. The board shall define by rule, pursuant to chapter
17	1-26, the grounds for refusing to license or for license revocation.
18	Section 18. That a NEW SECTION be added:
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19 20	36-39-18. Required state and federal criminal background check.
20	Each applicant for licensure shall submit to a state and federal criminal background
21 22	investigation by means of fingerprint checks by the Division of Criminal Investigation and
	the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Upon application, the board shall submit completed
23 24	fingerprint cards to the Division of Criminal Investigation. Upon completion of the criminal
24 25	background check, the Division of Criminal Investigation shall forward to the board all information obtained as a result of the criminal background check. This information shall
26 27	be obtained prior to the permanent licensure of any applicant. The board may require a state and federal criminal background check for any licensee who is the subject of a
27	disciplinary investigation by the board. Failure to submit to or cooperate with the criminal
20	background investigation is grounds for denial of an application or may result in revocation
29 30	of a license. The applicant shall pay for any fees charged for the cost of fingerprinting or
31	the criminal background investigation.
