Senate Bill 150

SENATE ENGROSSED

This bill has been extensively amended (hoghoused) and may no longer be consistent with the original intention of the sponsor.

1 **An Act to revise nonresident waterfowl licensure.**

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

3 **Section 1.** That § 41-6-18.1 be AMENDED:

4 **41-6-18.1. Nonresident waterfowl license, migratory bird permit, and**
 5 **federal stamp required--Violation as misdemeanor--Number of licenses.**

6 It is a Class 2 misdemeanor for a nonresident to hunt, take, or kill migratory
 7 waterfowl without a nonresident waterfowl license or a temporary nonresident waterfowl
 8 license, a migratory bird certification permit, and a federal migratory bird stamp, or in
 9 violation of the conditions of the licenses or the rules of the Game, Fish and Parks
 10 Commission.

11 A nonresident waterfowl license, except as otherwise provided in this title, entitles the
 12 licensee to hunt migratory waterfowl for ~~ten~~two periods of five consecutive days.

13 Four dollars received from the sale of each nonresident waterfowl license shall be
 14 placed in the land acquisition and development fund. The moneys from this fund shall be
 15 used to acquire, by purchase or lease, real property to be used primarily for game
 16 production. This license shall be in such form as the Game, Fish and Parks Commission
 17 shall prescribe.

18 The provision in this section limiting the validity of a nonresident waterfowl license to
 19 ~~ten~~two periods of five consecutive days does not apply in Union, Clay, Bon Homme,
 20 Yankton, and Charles Mix counties; and in such counties, the nonresident waterfowl
 21 license is valid during the same period as is a resident waterfowl license.

22 If the Game, Fish and Parks Commission allocates more than four thousand
 23 nonresident waterfowl licenses in a calendar year, any increase in the number of licenses
 24 allocated may not exceed five percent of the number of licenses allocated in the previous
 25 calendar year.
