1A LEGISLATIVE COMMEMORATION, Commending and honoring those who served in2the Korean War on the seventieth anniversary of the war.

3 WHEREAS, on June 25, 1950, communist North Korea invaded the Republic of Korea with

4 approximately one hundred thirty-five thousand troops, thereby initiating the Korean War;

6	WHEREAS,	after three	years of	bitter fighting,	hostilities	ended in	па	cease-fire marked	by

7	the	signing	of	the	armistice	at	Panmunjom	n on	July	· 27	, 1953.	Sevent	v	years	later,	the

- 8 peninsula still technically remains in a state of war; and
- 9 WHEREAS, during the Korean War, approximately twenty-six thousand South Dakotans

10 and nearly two million United States troops served in the Korean theater of operations, along

11 with the forces of the Republic of Korea and twenty other member nations of the United

12 <u>Nations, to defend freedom and democracy; and</u>

13 WHEREAS, one hundred sixty South Dakota residents died while serving in the Korean

- 14 War between 1950 and 1953; and
- 15 WHEREAS, since the end of the Korean War, the United States has maintained large-scale

16 military forces in Korea, ranging between fifty thousand and the current level of twenty-eight

17 thousand five hundred United States Armed Forces members serving in Korea to defend

- 18 external aggression and to promote regional peace:
- 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT COMMEMORATED, by the Ninety-Fifth Legislature of the State

20 of South Dakota, that the seventieth anniversary of the Korean War is recognized and that

21 those who served there are commemorated and honored.
