## 2020 South Dakota Legislature

FISCAL NOTE 2020-FN193A

SB 193 revises SB 38, an act to revise the General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2020.

Pursuant to Joint Rule 6C-1.2, this fiscal note seeks to determine the impact of SB 193 on the FY 2020 General Appropriations Act as approved by the 2019 Legislature. SB 38, previously enacted by the 2020 Legislature, amended the FY 2020 General Appropriations Act and FY 2020 General Fund receipts as approved by the 2019 Legislature.

For FY 2020, the enrolled version of SB 193 creates an increase of \$89,644,852 in Federal Fund authority.

The following tables display the changes in expenditures pursuant to SB 193.
