# AMENDMENT 192F FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

1	An Act to create the small business economic disaster relief subfund, to provide for
2	the transfer of certain funds into the subfund, to authorize the Economic
3	Development Finance Authority to make a grant to the subfund, to provide
4	for the continuous appropriation of the subfund, and to declare ar
5	emergency.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
7	Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added:
8	1-16G-85. Definitions.
9	Terms used in §§ 1-16G-85 through 1-16G-89 mean:
10	(1) "Commissioner," the Commissioner of the Governor's Office of Economic
11	Development;
12	(2) "Disaster relief subfund," the small business economic disaster relief subfund
13	created in § 1-16G-86;
14	(3) "COVID-19 state of emergency," the COVID-19 outbreak emergency declared by
15	the Governor as provided in § 34-48A-5, including any extension thereof; and
16	(4) "Small business," a business enterprise with no more than two hundred fifty full
17	time equivalent employees.
18	Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added:
19	1-16G-86. Disaster relief subfundCreationContinuous appropriation.
20	There is created within the revolving economic development and initiative func-
21	created by § 1-16G-3 the small business economic disaster relief subfund. Unexpended
22	money and any interest that may be credited to the subfund shall remain in subfund. Any

- 23 <u>money in the subfund is continuously appropriated to the Governor's Office of Economic</u>
- 24 Development. The commissioner may accept grants and gifts to the subfund.

#### 1 **Section 3.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

# 2 **1-16G-87.** Disaster relief subfund--Loans.

3 The commissioner may make loans from the disaster relief subfund to small 4 businesses adversely affected by the COVID-19 state of emergency. The commissioner 5 shall approve loans from the disaster relief subfund upon terms established by the 6 commissioner. Loan proceeds may be used for business purposes as approved by the

- 7 commissioner. No-A loan from the disaster relief subfund may exceed under this section
- 8 <u>must meet each of the following criteria:</u>
- 9 (1) The loan may not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars;
- 10 (2) The interest rate on the loan must not be at a rate greater than zero percent; and
- 11 (3) The loan may not include any fee for processing, administering, or servicing of the
  12 loan, except in the case of a default by the borrower.
- 13 **Section 4.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

# 14 **1-16G-88. Disaster relief subfund--Reporting.**

15 <u>The commissioner shall provide a report at each regular meeting of the Board of</u> 16 <u>Economic Development containing the name of each disaster relief subfund borrower, the</u> 17 <u>amount of the loan, and the maturity and interest rate date of the loan. The report shall</u> 18 <u>be a public document and shall be posted on the Governor's Office of Economic</u> 19 <u>Development website.</u>

20 **Section 5.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

# 1-16G-89. Disaster relief subfund loans--Confidentiality.

22 The meetings and deliberations of the commissioner and the Governor's Office of 23 Economic Development concerning loans from the disaster relief subfund are confidential 24 and exempt from public disclosure, chapter 1-25, and chapter 1-27. Any documentary 25 material or data made or received by the commissioner or the Governor's Office of 26 Economic Development for the purpose of acting upon an application for a loan from the 27 disaster relief subfund or administering the loan, to the extent that such material or data 28 consists of trade secrets or commercial or financial information regarding the operation of 29 such business, are not considered public records, and are exempt from disclosure. Nothing 30 in this section prohibits the disclosure of confidential information to the extent necessary 31 to collect or recoup the loan or the disclosure of confidential information to the Board of 32 Economic Development.

- 1 Section 6. The state treasurer shall transfer the sum of seven million dollars to the disaster
- 2 relief subfund from the small business credit initiative fund created in § 1-53-15.
- 3 Section 7. The state treasurer shall transfer the sum of one million dollars to the disaster
- 4 relief subfund from the value-added agriculture subfund created in § 1-53-34.
- 5 Section 8. The state treasurer shall transfer the sum of one million dollars to the
- 6 disaster relief subfund from the Governor's Office of Economic Development special
- 7 **revenue fund created** in § 1-53-7.
- 8 Section 9. The Economic Development Finance Authority may make a grant or gift of up to
- 9 two million dollars to the disaster relief subfund from the agricultural processing and export
- 10 <u>fund.</u>
- 11 Section 10. This Act is repealed on July 1, 2025.
- 12 Section 11. Whereas, this Act is necessary for the support of the state government and its
- 13 existing public institutions, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall be in
- 14 <u>full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.</u>
