1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions relating to internet and mail 2 order sales of cigarettes and tobacco products. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: Section 1. That § 10-50-1 be amended to read as follows: 4 5 10-50-1. Terms used in this chapter mean: 6 "Adult," any person who is at least the legal minimum purchase age; (1) 7 (2) "Consumer," any individual who is not a retailer or a licensed distributor or wholesaler pursuant to § 10-50-9; 8 9 (3)(2) "Dealer," or "retailer," any person other than a distributor or wholesaler, as defined 10 herein, who is engaged in this state in the business of selling cigarettes or tobacco 11 products at retail; 12 "Delivery sale," any sale of cigarettes to a consumer in the state where: 13 The purchaser submits the order for the sale by means of a telephonic or other 14 method of voice transmission, the mail or any other delivery service, or the

1	internet or other online service; or
2	(b) The cigarettes are delivered by use of the mail or delivery service. A sale of
3	cigarettes shall be a delivery sale regardless of whether the seller is located
4	within or without the state;
5	(5) "Delivery service," any person engaged in the commercial delivery of letters,
6	packages, or other containers;
7	(6)(3) "Distributor," any person engaged in this state in the business of producing or
8	manufacturing cigarettes, or importing into the state cigarettes, at least seventy-five
9	percent of which are purchased directly from the manufacturers thereof;
10	(7) "Legal minimum purchase age," the minimum age at which an individual may legally
11	purchase cigarettes in this state pursuant to § 34-46-2;
12	(8)(4) "Licensed distributor," or "licensed wholesaler," a distributor or wholesaler licensed
13	under the provisions of this chapter;
14	(9) "Mail," or "mailing," the shipment of cigarettes through the United States Postal
15	Office;
16	(10)(5) "Person," any individual, firm, fiduciary, partnership, limited liability
17	company, corporation, trust, or association, however formed;
18	(11)(6) "Sale" or "sell," shall include or apply to gifts, exchanges, and barter;
19	(12)(7) "Secretary," the secretary of revenue and regulation;
20	(13) "Shipping container," any container in which cigarettes are shipped in connection
21	with a delivery sale;
22	(14) "Shipping document," any bill of lading, airbill, or any other document used to
23	provide evidence of the undertaking by a delivery service to deliver a letter, package,
24	or other container;

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1	(15)(8) "Tobacco products," cigars, snuff, chewing tobacco, and any other products
2	made up or composed of tobacco in whole or in part, except cigarettes.
3	Section 2. That § 10-50-93 be repealed.
4	10-50-93. No person may make a delivery sale of cigarettes to any person who is under the
5	legal minimum purchase age in the state.
6	Any person accepting a purchase order for a delivery sale shall comply with:
7	(1) The age verification requirements provided in § 10-50-94;
8	(2) The disclosure requirements provided in § 10-50-95;
9	(3) The shipping requirements provided in § 10-50-96;
10	(4) The registration and reporting requirements provided in § 10-50-97;
11	(5) All other statutes of the state generally applicable to sales of cigarettes that occur
12	entirely within the state, and any law imposing an excise tax, sales tax, license,
13	revenue-stamping requirement, and escrow payment obligation as provided in chapter
14	10-50B; and
15	(6) The registration requirements in § 10-50-9.
16	Section 3. That § 10-50-94 be repealed.
17	10-50-94. No person may mail, ship, or otherwise deliver cigarettes in connection with a
18	delivery sale unless prior to the first delivery sale to the consumer:
19	(1) The person obtains from the consumer a statement signed by the consumer in writing
20	that certifies the consumer's address and that the consumer is at least eighteen years
21	of age. The statement shall also confirm that the consumer understands that signing
22	another person's name to the certification is illegal, the sale of cigarettes to any
23	individual under the legal minimum purchase age is illegal, the purchase of cigarettes
24	by any individual under the legal minimum purchase age is illegal, and that the

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1		consumer wants to receive a mailing from a tobacco company;
2	(2)	The person makes a good faith effort to verify the information contained in the
3		certification provided by the consumer pursuant to subdivision (1) against a
4		commercially available database, or obtains a photocopy or other image of the valid,
5		government-issued identification stating the date of birth or age of the individual
6		placing the order;
7	(3)	The person provides to the consumer, via e-mail or other means, a notice that meets
8		the requirements of § 10-50-95; and
9	(4)	If an order for cigarettes is made pursuant to an advertisement on the internet or other
10		advertising medium, the person receives payment for the delivery sale from the
11		prospective consumer by a credit or debit card that has been issued in the consumer's
12		name, or by check.
13	— Any p	person accepting a purchase order for a delivery sale may request that the prospective
14	consume	r provide an e-mail address.
15	Section	on 4. That § 10-50-95 be repealed.
16	10-50	9-95. The notice required under § 10-50-94 shall include a prominent and clearly legible
17	statement	t that:
18	(1)	Cigarette sales to consumers below the legal minimum purchase age are illegal;
19	(2)	Consists of one of the warnings set forth in section 4(a)(1) of the Federal Cigarette
20		Labeling and Advertising Act (15 U.S.C. § 1333(a)(1)) as of January 1, 2005, rotated
21		on a quarterly basis;
22	(3)	Sales of cigarettes are restricted to those consumers who provide verifiable proof of
23		age in accordance with § 10-50-94; and
24	(4)	Cigarette sales are subject to tax under § 10-50-3, and an explanation of how the tax

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1 has been or will be paid with respect to the delivery sale. 2 Section 5. That § 10-50-96 be repealed. 10-50-96. Any person who mails, ships, or otherwise delivers cigarettes in connection with 3 4 a delivery sale shall: 5 Include as part of the bill of lading or other shipping documents a clear and 6 conspicuous statement as follows: "Cigarettes: South Dakota Law Prohibits Shipping 7 to Individuals Under 18, and Requires the Payment of all Applicable Taxes"; and 8 Use a method of mailing, shipping, or delivery that obligates the delivery service to 9 require the consumer placing the purchase order for the delivery sale, or another adult 10 of legal minimum purchase age residing at the consumer's address, to sign to accept 11 delivery of the shipping container, and provide proof in the form of a valid 12 government-issued identification bearing a photograph of the individual who signs 13 to accept delivery of the shipping container. The person accepting delivery shall be 14 the addressee or another adult of legal minimum purchase age residing at the 15 consumer's address. 16 If the person accepting a purchase order for a delivery sale delivers the cigarettes without 17 using a delivery service, the person shall comply with each requirement of §§ 10-50-93 to 10-18 50-98, inclusive, applicable to a delivery service. The person is in violation of the provisions 19 of §§ 10-50-93 to 10-50-98, inclusive, if the person fails to comply with any such requirement. 20 Section 6. That § 10-50-97 be repealed. 21 10-50-97. Prior to making a delivery sale or mailing, shipping, or otherwise delivering 22 cigarettes in connection with any delivery sale, each person shall file with the department a

statement providing the person's name, trade name, and the address of the person's principal

place of business and any other place of business.

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1 Not later than the tenth day of each calendar month, each person that has made a delivery

- 2 sale or mailed, shipped, or otherwise delivered cigarettes in connection with any delivery sale
- 3 during the previous calendar month shall file with the department a memorandum or a copy of
- 4 the invoice that provides for each delivery sale:
- 5 (1) The name and address of the consumer;
- 6 (2) The brand or brands of the cigarettes that were sold; and
- 7 (3) The quantity of cigarettes that were sold.
- 8 Section 7. That § 10-50-98 be repealed.
- 9 10-50-98. In addition to any other provision of law, the secretary may assess, for a first
- violation of any provision of §§ 10-50-93 to 10-50-98, inclusive, a civil penalty of one thousand
- 11 dollars or five times the retail value of the cigarettes involved, whichever is greater. A
- subsequent violation is punishable by a civil penalty of five thousand dollars or five times the
- 13 retail value of the cigarettes involved, whichever is greater.
- Any person who knowingly violates any provision pursuant to §§ 10-50-93 to 10-50-98,
- 15 inclusive, or who knowingly and falsely submits a certification in another person's name, shall
- 16 for each offense be fined ten thousand dollars or five times the retail value of the cigarettes
- 17 involved, whichever is greater.
- 18 Any person failing to collect or remit to the department any tax required in connection with
- 19 a delivery sale shall be assessed, in addition to any other penalty, a penalty of five times the
- 20 retail value of the cigarettes involved.
- 21 Any cigarettes sold or attempted to be sold in a delivery sale that do not meet the
- 22 requirements of §§ 10-50-93 to 10-50-98, inclusive, shall be forfeited to the state and destroyed.
- 23 All fixtures, equipment, and all other materials and personal property on the premises of any
- 24 person who, with the intent to defraud the state, violates any of the requirements of §§ 10-50-93

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- to 10-50-98, inclusive, shall be forfeited to the state.
- 2 Section 8. That chapter 10-50 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 3 follows:

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- 4 No person who is engaged in the business of selling or distributing cigarettes or tobacco
- 5 products may ship or transport, or cause to be shipped or transported, cigarettes or tobacco
- 6 products to any consumer in the state. This section applies regardless of whether the person
- 7 engaged in the business of selling or distributing cigarettes or tobacco products is located within
- 8 or without the state.
- 9 Section 9. That chapter 10-50 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 10 follows:
- The attorney general may seek an injunction to restrain a threatened or actual violation of
- section 8 of this Act.
- 13 Section 10. That chapter 10-50 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 14 follows:
- The attorney general may bring a civil action in circuit court for any violation of section 8
- of this Act. In a civil action, in addition to injunctive or any other relief, the court may impose
- a civil penalty, for a first violation of section 8 of this Act, in the amount of one thousand dollars
- or five times the retail value of the cigarettes or tobacco products involved, whichever is greater.
- 19 A subsequent violation of section 8 of this Act is punishable by a civil penalty of five thousand
- dollars or five times the retail value of the cigarettes or tobacco products involved, whichever
- 21 is greater.
- Section 11. That chapter 10-50 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 23 follows:
- Each shipment, transport, or attempted shipment or transport, of cigarettes or tobacco

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- 1 products in violation of section 8 of this Act constitutes a separate violation.
- 2 Section 12. That chapter 10-50 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 Any cigarettes or tobacco products shipped, transported, or attempted to be shipped or
- 5 transported, in violation of section 8 of this Act shall be forfeited to the state and destroyed. In
- 6 addition, any profit, gain, gross receipt, or other benefit from the violation of section 8 of this
- 7 Act shall be disgorged and paid to the state treasurer for deposit in the state's general fund.
- 8 Section 13. That chapter 10-50 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
- 9 follows:
- Unless otherwise expressly provided, the penalties or remedies, or both, under sections 9 to
- 12, inclusive, of this Act are in addition to any other penalties and remedies available under any
- other law of the state. Nothing in this Act prohibits the collection of tax against a person
- receiving cigarettes or tobacco products in violation of this chapter.
