- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise budget transfer authority.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 3 Section 1. That § 4-8A-8 be amended to read as follows:
- 4 4-8A-8. Moneys The Bureau of Finance and Management may transfer moneys appropriated on a program basis by the general appropriation act may be transferred between program
- 6 accounts programs or classifications of expenditures either within or between departments,
- 7 <u>institutions</u>, and bureaus only at the written request of a governing body, department secretary,
- 8 or bureau commissioner, or his designee, only in accordance with procedures established by the
- 9 Bureau of Finance and Management and only upon approval by the special committee created
- 10 in this chapter. Moneys appropriated by the general appropriation act may be transferred
- between institutions of the state only upon written request of the appropriate governing board,
- 12 and upon specific written approval of the bureau of finance and management. The Bureau of
- 13 Finance and Management shall keep a record of all such authorizations of transfers and make
- them available for public inspection. The bureau of finance and management shall also submit an

1 informational report detailing all transfers approved to the special legislative committee

- 2 established in § 4-8A-2. At least ten days prior to approving any transfer of money between
- 3 departments for purposes other than for which it was originally appropriated by the general
- 4 appropriations act, the commissioner of the bureau of finance and management shall notify the
- 5 members of the joint appropriations committee of the proposed transfer.
