- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and submitting to the electors at the next general election
- an amendment to Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, relating to
- 3 classification of property for purposes of taxation.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
- 5 SOUTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
- 6 Section 1. That at the next general election held in the state, the following amendment
- 7 to Section 15 of Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, as set forth in
- 8 section 2 of this Joint Resolution, which is hereby agreed to, shall be submitted to the electors
- 9 of the state for approval.
- Section 2. That § 15 of Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota be
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- § 15. The Legislature shall make such provision by general taxation and by authorizing the
- school corporations to levy such additional taxes as with the income from the permanent school

- 1 fund shall secure a thorough and efficient system of common schools throughout the state. The
- 2 Legislature is empowered to classify properties within school districts <u>into separate classes</u> for
- 3 purposes of school taxation, and may constitute agricultural property a separate class. Taxes
- 4 shall be uniform on all property in the same class.
