## HOUSE BILL NO. 1030

Introduced by: The Committee on Health and Human Services at the request of the Department of Human Services

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise the rehabilitation services provided at public cost
- 2 to disabled and visually impaired persons based on economic need to include postsecondary
- 3 tuition and fees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 5 Section 1. That § 28-9-32 be amended to read as follows:
- 6 28-9-32. Except as otherwise provided by law or as specified in the state plan agreement with
- 7 the federal government, the following rehabilitation services shall be provided to persons with
- 8 disabilities based upon their economic need:
- 9 (1) Physical and mental restoration;
- 10 (2) Transportation, for any purpose except when determining the person's eligibility for
- 11 vocational rehabilitation services and the nature and extent of the services necessary;
- 12 (3) Occupational licenses, tools, equipment, and initial stocks and supplies, excluding 13 computers and computer-related devices needed to overcome a disability-related
- 14 impediment to employment;
- 15 (4) Maintenance for any purpose except when determining the person's eligibility for

2	(5)	Training books and materials; and
3	<u>(6)</u>	Tuition and fees for participating in postsecondary academic training programs under
4		the Federal Student Financial Assistance Program.
5	Section	on 2. That § 28-10-11 be amended to read as follows:
6	28-10	0-11. Except as otherwise provided by law or as specified in the state plan agreement
7	with the f	ederal government, the following rehabilitation services shall be provided to individuals
8	with visu	al disabilities based upon their economic need:
9	(1)	Physical restoration;
10	(2)	Transportation not provided to determine the eligibility of the individual for
11		vocational rehabilitation services and the nature and extent of the services necessary;
12	(3)	Occupational licenses;
13	(4)	Customary occupational tools and equipment, excluding computer-related assistive
14		technology devices needed to overcome visual disability as an impediment to
15		employment for competitive employment purposes;
16	(5)	Maintenance;
17	(6)	Training books and materials;
18	<u>(7)</u>	Tuition and fees for participating in postsecondary academic training programs under
19		the Federal Student Financial Assistance Program.
