4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:		
5	Section 1. That § 28-9-32 be amended to read as follows:		
6	28-9-32. Except as otherwise provided by law or as specified in the state plan agreement with		
7	the federal government, the following rehabilitation services shall be provided to persons with		
8	disabilities based upon their economic need:		
9	(1)	Physical and mental restoration;	
10	(2)	Transportation, for any purpose except when determining the person's eligibility for	
11		vocational rehabilitation services and the nature and extent of the services necessary;	
12	(3)	Occupational licenses, tools, equipment, and initial stocks and supplies, excluding	
13		computers and computer-related devices needed to overcome a disability-related	
14		impediment to employment;	

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1	(4)	Maintenance for any purpose except when determining the person's eligibility for
2		vocational rehabilitation services and the nature and extent of the services necessary;
3	(5)	Training books and materials; and
4	<u>(6)</u>	Tuition and fees for participating in postsecondary academic training programs under
5		the Federal Student Financial Assistance Program.
6	Section	on 2. That § 28-10-11 be amended to read as follows:
7	28-10	0-11. Except as otherwise provided by law or as specified in the state plan agreement
8	with the f	ederal government, the following rehabilitation services shall be provided to individuals
9	with visu	al disabilities based upon their economic need:
10	(1)	Physical restoration;
11	(2)	Transportation not provided to determine the eligibility of the individual for
12		vocational rehabilitation services and the nature and extent of the services necessary;
13	(3)	Occupational licenses;
14	(4)	Customary occupational tools and equipment, excluding computer-related assistive
15		technology devices needed to overcome visual disability as an impediment to
16		employment for competitive employment purposes;
17	(5)	Maintenance;
18	(6)	Training books and materials; and
19	<u>(7)</u>	Tuition and fees for participating in postsecondary academic training programs under
20		the Federal Student Financial Assistance Program.
