## SENATE APPROPRIATIONS ENGROSSED NO. **SB 26** - 1/28/2010

Introduced by: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Board of Regents

1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to make an additional appropriation to the Board of Regents

2 to construct an addition to the Northern State University Joseph H. Barnett Center.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That section 1 of chapter 91 of the 2009 Session Laws be amended to read as  
5 follows:

6 Section 1. The Board of Regents may contract for the construction, completion, furnishing,  
7 equipping, and maintaining of, including heating, air conditioning, plumbing, water, sewer,  
8 electric facilities, sidewalks, parking, landscaping, architectural and engineering services, and  
9 such other services or actions as may be required to construct an addition, not to exceed ~~four~~  
10 ~~thousand two hundred twenty-eight~~ thirty thousand seven hundred twenty-seven gross square  
11 feet, to the Northern State University Joseph H. Barnett Center, in Aberdeen, South Dakota.

12 Section 2. That section 2 of chapter 91 of the 2009 Session Laws be repealed.

13 ~~Section 2. The Board of Regents is hereby appropriated the sum of five hundred fifty-seven~~  
14 ~~thousand dollars (\$557,000) of other fund expenditure authority, payable from funds donated~~  
15 ~~for the purposes of this Act, for the total project cost authorized by this Act.~~



1       Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from other fund expenditure authority the sum of  
2 three million two hundred thousand dollars (\$3,200,000), or so much thereof as may be  
3 necessary, to the Board of Regents, payable from funds donated for the purposes of chapter 91  
4 of the 2009 Session Laws, for the total project cost authorized by chapter 91 of the 2009 Session  
5 Laws and this Act.

6       Section 4. The appropriation made in section 3 of this Act shall be available for four full  
7 fiscal years following the effective date of this Act.
