1	FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise the privilege on communications to clergyman to	
2	include certain lay ministers.	
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:	
4	Section 1. That § 19-13-16 be amended to read as follows:	
5	19-13-16. As used in §§ 19-13-16 to 19-13-18, inclusive:	
6	(1)	A "clergyman" is a minister, priest, rabbi, accredited Christian Science practitioner,
7		or other similar functionary of a religious organization, or an individual reasonably
8		believed so to be by the person consulting him the clergyman.
9	(2)	A communication is "confidential" if made privately and not intended for further
10		disclosure except to other persons present in furtherance of the purpose of the
11		communication.
12	<u>(3)</u>	A "lay minister" is a person working as a spiritual advisor under the supervision of a
13		clergyman.
14	Section 2. That § 19-13-17 be amended to read as follows:	
15	19-13-17. A person has a privilege to refuse to disclose and to prevent another from

disclosing a confidential communication by the person to a clergyman or a lay minister in his the

- 2 <u>clergyman's or lay person's</u> professional character as spiritual adviser.
- 3 Section 3. That § 19-13-18 be amended to read as follows:
- 4 19-13-18. The privilege described by § 19-13-17 may be claimed by the person, by his the
- 5 <u>person's</u> guardian or conservator, or by his the person's personal representative if he the person
- 6 is deceased. The person who was the clergyman or the lay minister at the time of the
- 7 communication is presumed to have authority to claim the privilege but only on behalf of the
- 8 communicant.
