A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Designating "Yesterday's Tomorrows" in Deadwood and the Deadwood Adams House Museum.

WHEREAS, South Dakota has been and continues to be home to any number of industrious and innovative people who have thought about our state's future; and

WHEREAS, the Smithsonian Institution's "Museum on Main Street" program offers a portable exhibition that looks at finding the future in the media, the design of homes, methods of transportation, and community planning; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Seventy-seventh Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that September 2 - October 4, 2002, be named "Yesterday's Tomorrows" in Deadwood and the Deadwood Adams House Museum.
