- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and submitting to the electors at the next general election
- an amendment to Article XII, Section 2 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota,
- 3 relating to expenditures from funds established by a two-thirds vote of both houses of the
- 4 Legislature.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
- 6 SOUTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
- 7 Section 1. That at the next general election held in the state, the following amendment to
- 8 Article XII, section 2 of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, as set forth in section 2
- 9 of this Joint Resolution, which is hereby agreed to, shall be submitted to the electors of the state
- 10 for approval.
- Section 2. That Article XII, section 2 of the Constitution, of the State of South Dakota, be
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- § 2. The general appropriation bill shall embrace nothing but appropriations for ordinary

1 expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial departments of the state, the current expenses 2 of state institutions, interest on the public debt, and for common schools. All other 3 appropriations shall be made by separate bills, each embracing but one object, and shall require 4 a two-thirds vote of all the members of each branch of the Legislature. The Legislature may not 5 appropriate any money from any fund that has been dedicated to a special purpose pursuant to 6 a two-thirds majority vote of both houses of the Legislature for any purpose other than the 7 special purpose for which the fund is dedicated, unless such appropriation is approved by a two-8 thirds majority vote of both houses of the Legislature in a separate bill embracing only one 9 subject matter.
