The petition signatures must be filed along with the verifications completed pursuant to § 2-1-10.

A sworn affidavit, signed by at least two-thirds of the petition sponsors, must be filed with the secretary of state along with the signatures on the petition, stating:

(1) The documents filed constitute the entire petition; and

(2) The petition contains, to the best knowledge of the petition sponsors, at least the number of valid signatures required by S. D. Const. , Art. III, § 1, or S. D. Const. , Art. XXIII, § 1.

The State Board of Elections shall prescribe the form of the affidavit."

FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SB 220: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to appropriate money for the ordinary expenses of the legislative, judicial, and executive departments of the state, the current expenses of state institutions, interest on the public debt, and common schools.

Introduced by: The Joint Committee on Appropriations

Was read the first time and the President Pro Tem waived the committee referral pursuant to JR 6D-1.

SIGNING OF BILLS

The President publicly read the title to

SB 6: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to authorize a loan from the South Dakota housing infrastructure fund to a school district adjoining a federal military installation for the construction or expansion of a school building.

SB 14: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise and repeal provisions related to agricultural production facilities and to provide a penalty therefor.

SB 73: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require that an individual registering as a voter when applying for a driver license be a resident of this state for the purposes of voting.

SB 216: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to reduce the growth in the assessed value of owner-occupied property, limit increases in certain property tax revenues, revise provisions regarding school district excess tax levies, and revise eligibility requirements for a property tax assessment freeze.

HB 1005: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to modify the requirement for payment of a private home study by the Department of Social Services.

HB 1039: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to amend the programs reimbursing a teacher or school counselor for earning national board certification.

HB 1130: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide permissible dates for municipal and school district elections.

HB 1184: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to amend the deadline for filing a petition to initiate a measure or constitutional amendment.

HB 1256: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require the inclusion of certain information on a candidate's nominating petition or on a ballot question petition.

HB 1264: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require the disclosure of an outstanding loan balance on a campaign finance disclosure report.

HJR 5003: A JOINT RESOLUTION, Proposing and submitting to the voters at the next general election an amendment to the Constitution of the State of South Dakota, requiring that a constitutional amendment receive an affirmative vote of sixty percent of the votes cast before the measure is enacted.
