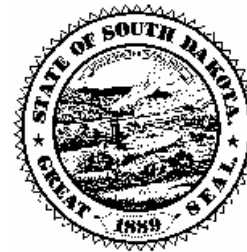

NOTICES OF PROPOSED RULES: (The date in parentheses is the date the rules were filed in the Legislative Research Council.)

South Dakota Board of Regents: (April 6, 2004) intends to adopt **EMERGENCY** rules to implement the South Dakota Opportunity Scholarship Program. The rules will establish the conditions of eligibility to receive the scholarship award, the requirements for retaining eligibility and the conditions recipients and participating institutions must meet to assure the operation of the program as envisioned by the Legislature. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the board, is SDCL 13-55-36.

A copy of the proposed rules may be obtained from the South Dakota Board of Regents, 306 East Capitol, Suite 200, Pierre, South Dakota 57501.

Department of Labor: Board of Technical Professions: (April 8, 2004) has filed rules that will make it possible to use applications interactive over the internet, update references, change definitions, allow test vendors, permit students with five semesters of engineering to take the FE exam, provide for licensees to reactivate and reinstate, retake land surveying exam, add rules for fire alarm systems, and clarify expectations from licensees on exempt projects. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the board, is SDCL 36-18A-22, 36-18A-34, 36-18A-27, 36-18A-40, and 36-18A-42.

A public hearing will be held in Room 304, 3rd floor, 2040 W. Main Street, Rapid City, South Dakota, on May 10, 2004, at 1:00 p.m. Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained

from and written comments sent to the South Dakota Board of Technical Professions, 2040 W. Main, Suite 304, Rapid City, South Dakota 57702-2447. Written comments must be received by May 7, 2004, to be considered. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible place.
