Notice of Proposed Rules

<u>Department of Game, Fish and Parks:</u> (August 15, 2024) intends to amend rules to cap the number of nonresident turkey licenses in the Black Hills; modify the statewide Archery Spring turkey hunting units; modify the existing fish harvest regulations on Belle Fourche Reservoir; modify snagging on Lake Oahe; modify bobcat trapping and hunting; modify scientific names for certain species of crayfish to reflect updates in taxonomic classification; and modify the species of crayfish that can be taken. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 41-2-18 and 41-8-20.

A public hearing at which persons may present amendments, data, opinions, and arguments for or against the proposed rules will be held at the Outdoor Campus - West, 4130 Adventure Trail, Rapid City, South Dakota, on September 5, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. (MT). Copies of the proposed rules may be obtained without charge from, and written comments on the proposed rules may be sent to, the Secretary of the Department of Game, Fish and Parks, Foss Building, 523 East Capitol Avenue, Pierre, South Dakota 57501. The rules are also available online at https://rules.sd.gov. Comments may also be submitted at https://gfp.sd.gov/forms/positions. All written and email comments must include the name, city, and state of the person submitting them. The comment period will close 72 hours prior to the date of the hearing. This hearing is being held in a physically accessible location. South Dakota Conservation Commission (Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources): (August 15, 2024) intends to repeal rules defining "urban area" and the purpose of the soil conservation award program; and in alignment with House Bill 1033 enacted in the 2024 legislative session, amend rules to clarify the definition of active agricultural producer; specify who is eligible to receive a natural resources conservation award; clarify the nomination process for the award; refine the criteria used to select award recipients; and modify information pertaining to the submittal of selections to the Conservation Commission. The general authority for these rules, as cited by the department, is SDCL 38-7-30.
