We are pleased to share the South Dakota Arts Council's State Fiscal Year 2018 annual report with you. The past fiscal year took our agency in a new direction, with a new strategic plan with a focus on improved constituent services and more equitable policies and practices throughout all grants, services, and programming.

We are called to fairly serve and represent all South Dakotans as stewards of the public trust. The South Dakota Arts Council is mindful of taxpayers' dollars that advance the arts in South Dakota and takes seriously this great responsibility.

All strategies and tactics used to work toward our major goals were designed with input from our most underserved communities with the express intention to provide opportunities and cultivate meaningful and lasting partnerships. We believe the public arts and culture sector can lead the way to more cohesive communities by providing a platform for and amplifying the voices of the most effective communicators in our society: artists.

In FY18, the Arts Council awarded 474 grants supported with funds from the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency, and the State of South Dakota through a portion of the tourism promotion tax. Our funding reached across the state in the form of project support, operational support, and arts education grants and programs. The Council's FY18 co-sponsored activities reached more than 1 million people, including over 326,000 youth, and involved approximately 9,300 artists. The total FY18 SDAC budget of \$1.74 million included \$1.36 million in grants and special project support, which generated \$19.48 million in local cash matching funds.

Additionally, the nonprofit arts, unlike most industries, leverage significant amounts of event-related spending by their audiences. Attendance at arts events generates related commerce for hotels, restaurants, transportation, and more. Cultural audiences spend an average of \$31.47 per event, per person, excluding the cost of admission.

As you read through this annual report, you will discover the diverse impact South Dakota Arts Council programs and partners have on our state's quality of life, cultural tourism, and economic development. Thank you for your past and continued support.

SOUTH DAKOTA ARTS COUNCIL

The South Dakota Arts Council is structured administratively as a state agency within the Department of Tourism. The agency is advised by an 11-member board, appointed by the Governor, which meets regularly to recommend grant awards and otherwise promote and advance the arts across the state.

The South Dakota Arts Council receives support from the State of South Dakota, through the Department of Tourism, and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency. State funds are generated by a portion of the state tourism promotion tax.

50+ YEARS OF SERVICE

Established in 1966 and funded by the State Legislature and the National Endowment for the Arts, the South Dakota Arts Council is a state agency serving South Dakotans and their communities through the arts. The Council is the advisory board to the SDAC staff within the Department of Tourism. Council members are appointed by the Governor.

The South Dakota Arts Council was created to unify and coordinate the development of the arts across the state through public service, arts education programs, access and inclusion, cultural tourism, grants and services, and to act as the steward of the state's federal appropriation from the National Endowment for the Arts.

ENABLING LEGISLATION

INTRODUCTION TO SOUTH DAKOTA CODIFIED LAWS 1-22

1966 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The South Dakota Legislature, being aware of the impact of culture on a stable economy, desires to stimulate, encourage, and give recognition and assistance to the arts which, in order to grow and flourish, depend upon freedom, imagination and individual initiative. While the development of the arts has long been considered a matter of local concern, there is a need to unify and coordinate these forces on a statewide basis. The arts, the creative spirit which motivates them and which they personify, are an essential part of the state's human resources.

The best interest of the state and its people requires that artistic expression in all of its forms be disseminated for everyone to see, appreciate and enjoy in order for our cultural and economic progress to be sustained and given impetus. There is created a South Dakota Arts Council composed of eleven members appointed by the Governor.

PURPOSE

Recognizing the importance of creativity in the lives of all South Dakotans, the Council makes quality arts accessible throughout the state by providing encouragement, grants, services and information to artists, arts organizations, schools and the public. The Council strives to ensure access to the arts and educational arts opportunities as part of lifelong learning in South Dakota.

VISION

Our vision is to transform South Dakota's communities and people through the arts. We see deeper public awareness broadening appreciation for the fine arts; better arts education reviving school environments; wider access to the arts fostering understanding among cultures; and artists and arts organizations enhancing the quality of life for all South Dakotans.

VALUES

To accomplish its mission and support its vision, the Arts Council is guided by a strategic plan informed by input from constituents throughout the state and grounded in public values.

We believe:

- Greater public awareness of the value of the arts fosters sustained public and private support.
- Arts education stimulates creativity, communication, and lifelong learning.
- Universal access to the arts is intrinsic to the well-being of all South Dakotans
- Artists are central to the creative environment of South Dakota.
- Arts organizations contribute to vibrant, progressive communities.
- The arts play an essential role in cultural tourism.

GOALS

As we strive for more equitable approaches at the South Dakota Arts Council, we are led by three driving forces: Learn, Connect, Progress.

Learn Goals:

- 1) K-12 Arts Education: Work to improve access to and inclusion of arts education in K-12 schools.
- Workforce Development: Promote youth participation in the arts to develop skills and careers. Motivate and support artists and arts businesses to flourish in our state.
- Professional Development: Provide and support continuing professional development opportunities to artists and arts leaders throughout South Dakota.

Connect Goals:

- Resources and Information: Develop regular, ongoing methods for artists, organizations, and communities to access information and resources to support their needs in the arts.
- Outreach and Technical Assistance: Increase efforts to include the voices of all South Dakotans and improve access to staff or other professionals to assist in individual and community efforts to advance the arts.
- Cooperation: Advance shared goals through partnerships with other state agencies, private entities, and the business community.

Progress Goals:

- Community Development: Foster strong communities locally and statewide with a sense of place that is creative and beneficial to all.
- 2) The Essential Arts: Clearly and effectively communicate the importance of the arts in education, community livability, and the economy to policy-makers and stakeholders throughout South Dakota.

Arts Education

Comprehensive arts education opportunities lead to the acquisition of job skills and the development of creative thinking, problem solving, and communications skills.

The South Dakota Arts Council helps advance learning in and through the arts by expanding access to and frequency of these opportunities through several arts education programs carried out in schools across the state.

ARTISTS IN SCHOOLS & COMMUNITIES

Through the AISC program, we funded 201 weeks of professional teaching-artist residencies at 80 sites across SD including schools, healthcare institutions, and community arts and service organizations.

POETRY OUT LOUD

In FY18, 27 schools and more than 1,000 students participated in Poetry Out Loud. Our state champion, Gage Gramlick, a student at Lincoln High School in Sioux Falls, went on to win the original spoken word contest at the POL National Finals in Washington, D.C.!

EDUCATOR GRANTS

Assisted 13 educators and teaching artists with classroom projects and professional development.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Arts Education isn't just for kids! Professional development opportunities such as Arts Lab, the State Arts Conference and the Arts Education Institute for teachers support arts and educational professionals throughout the state.

ARTISTS IN SCHOOLS & COMMUNITIES

In FY18, South Dakota Arts Council funded residencies engaged 329 artists; 13,144 youth; and 8,597 adults;

50 percent of these residencies reached some of South Dakota's most underserved citizens, including military veterans, people with disabilities, individuals living in health or correctional institutions, individuals living below the poverty line, older adults, and youth at risk.



Touring Arts

The South Dakota Arts Council's Touring Arts program helps make the arts accessible in all regions of the state by providing funds to non-profit sponsor organizations for presenting Touring Arts programs and performances. The artists and art exhibitions listed on the roster have been selected on the basis of quality by review panels and the Arts Council.

IMPACT

In Fiscal Year 18, the SDAC supported 203 performances through the Touring Arts programs. The 26 individuals and groups on the Touring Arts roster reached a collective audience of 40,362 youth and 43,577 adults, directly benefiting 453 artists in 71 communities across the state.

In 2018, the roster welcomed seven new artists and ensembles and grew to 33.

A GLIMPSE AT AN ARTIST WORKSHOP

In May 2018, long-time roster artist, Dick Termes, visited Belle Fourche Middle School. As part of the lesson, students learned about six-point perspective and three-dimensional models. During the workshop, Termes hands out small spheres to each student. Together they explore making their own designs out of triangles and squares. Termes shows them how to repeat their design onto the sphere.


