**Black Hills State University**  
**Annual Report on Intellectual Diversity and Free Exchange of Ideas**

 Black Hills State University has a partnership with Lighthouse Services, Inc. to provide an [anonymous ethics and compliance hotline](#) for reporting possible ethics and Title IX violations.
- **National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE)**  
 BHSU regularly administers this survey to first-year students and seniors. Questions related to intellectual diversity are included in the questions. Relevant results from 2022 are as follows:
  - When asked, “During the current school year, about how often have you included diverse perspectives (political, religious, racial/ethnic, gender, etc.) in course discussions or assignments?” 51% of first-year students and 53% of senior-level students responded: “often” or “very often.” In 2021 49% of first-year students and 48% of seniors made this same response.
  - In response to the question asking how often they “tried to better understand someone else’s views by imagining how an issue looks from their perspective?” 71% of first -year students and 66% of senior-level students responded “often” or “very often.” In the previous year the responses were 64% and 71% respectively.
  - When asked, “During the current school year, about how often have you had discussions with people from the following groups: people with religious beliefs other than your own?” 67% of first-year students and 57% of senior-level students responded “often” or “very often.” In the previous year the responses were 62% and 64% respectively.
  - In response to the same prompt about “People with political views other than your own?” 67% of first-year students and 55% of senior-level students responded

- “often” or “very often.” In the previous year, the responses were 54% and 68% respectively.
- When asked “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? I feel comfortable being myself at this institution?” 86% of first-year and 89% of senior-level students responded either “agree” or “strongly agree.” In the previous year, the responses were 88% and 89% respectively.

Conclusions from data: Course discussions and assignments are somewhat less likely to include diverse perspectives than they were in the previous year. First-year students are having slightly more contact with diverse ideas in their overall college experiences, while seniors are having slightly less.

- **Civic Education and Engagement**

- National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) participating campus. NSLVE data are used to track student voter participation.
  - BHSU is an Institutional Member of AASCU’s American Democracy Project: A key initiative for membership institutions is the [Voter Education and Engagement](#) initiative.
  - The Political Science Department and the Office of the President organized a Civics Day celebration to venerate the constitution and celebrate civic responsibilities. This event was open to the public and included non-partisan speeches by student leaders and Representative Scott Odenbach. A voter drive was also conducted on campus that day by students.
- BHSU hosted the We the People state championship, February 24, 2022. We provided funding, lunch, judges, and facilities for this high school civics debate event.
- SD Legislative Internship Program: one BHSU student applied to serve as intern for the 2021 legislative session.

**Actions taken by each institution to promote and ensure intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.**

DSU's Opportunity Center is designed to focus energy on the guidance and encouragement of all students as they work to attain their academic, personal, and career goals, and to provide an environment that contributes to a student's immediate and continued success. The university developed the Opportunity Center with the focus that it is a place where people matter, and where everyone can find belonging and opportunity.

There is an ongoing campus effort to increase the number of women in STEM fields enrolled at DSU. This effort is focused on academic recruiting, women in cyber, stronger direct marketing and raising more scholarship money for female athletes. Dakota State's outreach program CybHER™ has helped increase gender diversity in cybersecurity since 2013. This initiative has reached well over 28,000 students, through events, camps and classroom visits intended to empower, motivate, and educate girls and boys in cybersecurity. In the summer of 2022 CISA Assistant Director Bridget Bean spoke to girls at a CybHER camp about the capability of women in STEM and cyber security.

The History and Ethics Forum this fall invited Dr. Heather Wilson, former United States Secretary of the Air Force under General Mattis, former SDSMT president, and current University of Texas El Paso as our speaker. Dr. Wilson's address focused on expanding the Cyber-Security Workforce. The History and Ethics Forum is an annual event designed to bring in prominent national thought leaders to campus to address important topics of the day.

In 2021-22 Dakota State University formed the Shared Governance Committee. Shared governance is a structure and process for partnership, equity, accountability, and ownership among employees. Shared leadership facilitates the decision-making process, information sharing, and transparency.

In 2022 the DSU Center for Teaching and Learning conducted sessions for faculty and staff on autism spectrum disorders. Training sessions like this equip our faculty with new instructional strategies to improve outcomes for students with ASD and inform our student life programming.

**Northern State University**  
**Annual Report on Intellectual Diversity and Free Exchange of Ideas**

**Actions taken by each institution to promote and ensure intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.**

1. The Center for Public History recently held a one-day workshop for secondary education social science teachers. We had twelve participants. The subject of the workshop was American Foundations: The American Founding. We covered the causes of the Revolutionary War, weaknesses of the Articles of Confederation and the reasons for a Constitutional Convention, arguments for and against the new Constitution (Federalists/Anti-Federalists), and the Bill of Rights. The workshop concluded with a one-hour session on how to use the content in the classroom. Content was delivered by Prof. Jon Schaff and Prof. Dave Grettler while the methodology session was led by Prof. Christian Pirlet. The workshop is part of a one-credit graduate level course the participants are taking for Fall 2022. The students will create a lesson plan, implement the plan if relevant to their fall courses, and then submit a reaction paper and their lesson plan. We hope this is the first of an annual event, perhaps expanding to include elementary education teachers as well.

In the first year of operation, the Center sponsored Constitution Day activities as well as the National History Day competition at the Northern State campus. We published our first newsletter in Fall of 2021. During the academic year, we hosted Representative Dusty Johnson talking about Congress, Prof. Joseph Bottum talking about religion and contemporary political movements, and Brian Bengs discussing the Russian invasion of Ukraine as a matter of international law. We also secured a grant from the Knight Foundation to help pay for these and other events for the coming three years.

2. NSU celebrated the U.S. Constitution on Constitution Day, September 19, 2022.
  - US flags (courtesy of the Exchange Club) displayed in Student Center, Library, and Technology Center
  - The League of Women Voters registered people to vote in the Student Center
  - U.S. military recruiters had a table in the Student Center
  - Dakota Prairie Museum had a display in the Student Center
  - Campus Republicans gave out free red, white, and blue cookies and a student member dressed in an Uncle Sam outfit at a table in Student Center (new)
  - Exchange Club displayed their large portable Freedom Shrine in Student Center along with a miniature Bill of Rights, plus had free miniature US flags to distribute at a table (new)
  - Multicultural Office had a table in the Student Center (new)
  - Pocket copies of the Constitution passed out by a couple of groups in the Student Center

- Two NSU students wore Uncle Sam outfits and spent time in Student Center and in their classes (having two outfits is new)
- TV monitors around campus ran a CD graphic
- Student Affairs decorated Student Center mall, which included large US flags (new)
- The Exchange Club posted several hundred US flags around Aberdeen (on September 17)
- There was a link on the NSU website to a copy of the Constitution, Constitution Fun Facts, and a Constitution Trivia Game
- NSU News ran a notice about CD for a couple of weeks
- Constitution Day signs taped to doors and windows in several campus buildings
- A CD graphic posted on NSU TV for a couple of weeks
- Emails went out to CAS to encourage students, administrators, staff, and faculty to dress and decorate offices in red, white, and blue.
- Food Services had some special themed food in the Den
- Noon Forum had a Constitutionally themed topic
- Professor Tim Woods brought a 20+ member men's' ensemble to sing at the Student Center (new)
- Our flag retirement ceremony, that we usually do each year, scheduled for 4pm on September 19, was cancelled because of high wind.

**Actions taken by each institution to promote and ensure intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas:**

1. South Dakota School of Mines and Technology celebrated U.S. Constitution Day on September 16, 2022. Specific events included:
  - An email was sent to all students with the National Voter Education Website linked;
  - Students, faculty, and staff could visit the Surbeck Information desk for a free pocket constitution;
  - Students could compete in a constitution quiz to win a pair of movie tickets;
  - Voter registration information was posted around Surbeck and the digital screens;
  - A Roamin' Boards event was held where students could draft and pin an amendment that they would like to be added to the United States Constitution. There were 6 boards in all traveling between the Surbeck Center, The Devereaux Library, and the O'Hara Building;
  - South Dakota Mines hosted Ms. Lila Mehlhaff, Human Services Coordinator for Rapid City, SD. Ms. Melhaff spoke about the Constitution and Indian Treaty-Making.

3. South Dakota Mines continues to require all faculty to publish a "Freedom in Learning" statement on each course syllabus. The statement is:

“Under Board of Regents and University policy, student academic performance may be evaluated solely on an academic basis, not on opinions or conduct in matters unrelated to academic standards. Students should be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any course of study and to reserve judgement about matters of opinion, but they are responsible for learning the content of any course of study for which they are enrolled. Students who believe that an academic evaluation reflects prejudiced or capricious consideration of student opinions or conduct unrelated to academic standards should contact the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at [provost@sdsmt.edu](mailto:provost@sdsmt.edu) to initiate a review of the evaluation.”

We created the [provost@sdsmt.edu](mailto:provost@sdsmt.edu) email address two years ago so student complaints regarding freedom in learning would come directly to the Provost’s Office.

4. We launched a new method in which students, faculty, and staff can report complaints or file a grievance. We use the platform called Advocate, which is also used to report and track student academic integrity and student conduct complaints.
5. We continued the NSF funded initiative to increase the enrollment of first-generation students has begun. The grant provides scholarships to first-generation students. We also link those incoming students with mentors who are also first-generation.
6. The **Mines Advantage** program which included a “Cultural and Global Inclusion” component with a learning outcome that students develop effective interactions with people of different backgrounds, along with the demonstration of an understanding and appreciation of human differences went through a reset and overhaul. The new **Personal Development Promise Program** will continue to have a similar competency that we are calling Global Awareness & Inclusion. Another competency will be Community Service & Citizenship.
7. Discussions regarding Intellectual diversity continue to be included in our freshman orientation sessions. These discussions include the description of freedom of expression and the need to include and accept varying perspectives.

**Summary of Campus Climate Assessment**

The University is committed to administering the Skyfactor Campus Climate, Safety, and Sexual Assault Assessment every two years to university employees and currently enrolled students. The assessment measures 15 dimensions of faculty, staff, and students' perceptions and satisfaction with the institution. SDSU has administered the Campus Climate survey in 2017, 2019, 2020, and 2022. While proprietary information cannot be publicly available, annual summary reports are shared with the campus.

### **Complaint Reporting Practices**

SDSU has validated that it maintains reporting protocols for a variety of situations, depending on the concern raised. In addition, the process for investigation varies based upon employment relationship, conduct reported, and student status. Beginning in fall 2019, SDSU added “First Amendment/Intellectual Diversity” as a report/complaint category in its online reporting portal, Lighthouse, in which reports may be submitted anonymously.

*The Rabbit Report* is a weekly student publication sent to all students while classes are in session via the SDSU Students’ Association. The Rabbit Report includes a reporting section with links to reporting procedures for a variety of concerns, including anonymous reporting options. In addition, the HR Newsletter sent electronically to all SDSU employees includes information on how to report concerns, including anonymous reporting options. ### **Speakers and Events**

#### **Speakers:**

SDSU implemented a university events calendar during this past year and promotes speakers open to the public through this tool. In addition SDSU promotes student organization speakers and events through [Jacks Club Hub](#), an online tool designed for student organizations to promote their organization and their programming. Finally, events are promoted through an intranet portal, InsideState, to all SDSU employees.

South Dakota State University submits its speaker list to the Board of Regents monthly.

### **Training Sessions for University Employees and Students**

The SDSU Office of General Counsel provided training sessions regarding the First Amendment and intellectual diversity to at least 200 individuals in the campus community between November 1, 2021 to October 31, 2022. A list of completed training sessions, as well as the approximate number of attendees for each session, is included in this section. The SDSU Office of General Counsel has maintained a link to a pre-recorded training presentation regarding the First Amendment on SDSU's business portal, InsideState. This training presentation was last updated on August 1, 2022 and is the basis for the training sessions conducted by the Office of General Counsel. Bystander training was also provided to freshmen students as part of campus onboarding, during which, students were informed of how to report concerns on a wide variety of topics. Additional sessions are scheduled for the future.

Additionally, SDSU made information available for new students entering the University, excluding dual credit students, via information sessions with Title IX/EO staff at New Student Orientation. All SDSU students, excluding those enrolled as dual credit, were assigned an online training, titled “Sexual Violence Prevention” through SDSU’s existing SDBOR contract with Vector Solutions for online training resources. The training was mandatory for all students new to SDSU in 2022 and all Intercollegiate athletes. The training was communicated via email and include additional training on “Alcohol Awareness” and optional “Active Shooter” training.

All SDSU employees were mandated to complete online Title IX training through Vector Solutions, in addition to “Americans with Disabilities Act Overview” and optional “Active Shooter” training. In Spring 2022, the Title IX training had a completion rate of 99.6%

### **Academic and Other Activities**

Course syllabi are required by SDSU Course Syllabus Policy 2:3 to have the following statement included, and this was communicated during this period:

*Freedom in Learning Statement: Students are responsible for learning the content of any course of study in which they are enrolled. Under Board of Regents and University policy, student academic performance shall be evaluated solely on an academic basis and students should be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any courses of study. Students who believe that an academic evaluation is unrelated to academic standards but is related instead to judgment of their personal opinion or conduct should first contact the instructor of the course. If the student remains unsatisfied, the student may contact the Department Head, Dean, or both, of the college which offers the class to initiate a review of the evaluation.*

SDSU validated that it offers the System General Education Requirements (SGRs) courses in communication, mathematics, and sciences. There is an array of elective courses within the requirements for Social Sciences and Arts and Humanities, which provide an awareness of the histories and psycho-social, economic, and political structures, as well as an understanding of the contributions of diverse cultures. Course offerings to meet the Social Sciences elective include, but are not limited to, American Indian Studies, Anthropology, Human Geography, United States History, American Government, American Political Issues, Political Ideologies, State and Local Government, and Sociology of Rural America. Course offerings to meet the Arts and Humanities elective include, but are not limited to, American Indian Studies, World Civilization, Western Civilization, and Lakota.

**(2) Events or occurrences that impeded intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas, or complaints received by campuses.**

**SDSU**

- Student submitted complaint that was referred to the EO/Title IX Office about course content in MATH 401, Senior Capstone, stating that videos “*deprecate and disparage white males, while making numerous false claims about a variety of facts related to diversity and affirmative action*”. (11/17/21).
- Student submitted anonymous complaint– “*Professor was teaching about culture and diversity in NURS 444 Population-Centered care. [Professor] mentioned the children's nursery rhyme eenie meenie miney mo as an example of speech that was once commonly used that is no longer acceptable. In the old nursery rhyme [Professor] explained that "eenie meenie miney mo catch a tiger by the toe" was originally "eenie meenie miney mo catch an n-word by the toe". [Professor] then corrected herself and proceeded to recite the line "eenie meenie miney mo catch a n\*\*\*\*\* by the toe" using the actual word. Students became visibly uncomfortable and there was whispering after the comment was made. In addition, there were black students present in the classroom. [Professor] continued to teach the class without acknowledging her statement.*” (1/12/2022)
- Faculty reported a free speech presentation/demonstration occurring outside the University Student Union concerning discrimination based on religion. (9/2/2022)
- Faculty reported a free speech presentation/demonstration occurring outside the University Student Union included hate speech. (9/12/2022)
- Student reported Christian and Baptist groups conducted free speech presentations near the University Student Union and included hate speech and discriminatory language. The information shared allegedly “*hindered the ethical and equitable redistribution of knowledge, telling some students they are going to hell.*” (9/14/2022)
- Student reported that a free speech demonstration outside the University Student Union, pertaining to abortion violated his religious rights and exceed the bounds of free speech as the presenters “*participate(d) in actions that make violence occur on campus.*”. (9/27/2022)

**Actions taken by each institution to promote and ensure intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.**

USD continues its tradition of bringing in a variety of speakers both to the classroom and for broad, campus-wide lectures and events. Election years tend to bring more political speakers to campus and this year was no exception. There were several in-class discussions and forums with candidates from both parties. They can be found in the attached speaker report.

The Opportunity Center is up and running at USD. Jordan Bonstrom was hired for the director position in May. He has several years of student affairs experience, including housing and student rights and responsibilities. The last few months have been spent meeting with offices across campus to build support for the office and assist with finding resources for students in need. The Opportunity Center also offers assistance to any campus entity that is interested in hosting events or speakers on campus and has done intentional outreach to different student organizations in order to make them aware of the support provided by the center. A coordinator has also been hired to assist with programming and the office has had over 2000 student contacts since the semester began.

In addition to supporting students from all aspects of campus, the Opportunity Center also oversees the President's Senior Leadership Institute. This year, just over 50 students are participating in the program where they will learn leadership skills and interact with alumni from across the state. The cohort just completed their tour of South Dakota where they spent three days travelling the state and getting to know each other better. The trip included a tour of the Rosebud reservation, breakfast discussion with alumni in Rapid City, and a visit to the black hills and Mount Rushmore to learn more about tourism in the state.

USD continues to foster free speech and the ability to demonstrate that right on campus. This year was more active than the past couple with outdoor expressive activities. A variety of smaller scale expressive activity did occur on campus, but individuals or small groups in outdoor spaces do not require prior approval and as such may not have made our report.
