
- (1) Sets forth all actions taken by each institution to promote and ensure intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas; and
- (2) Describes any events or occurrences that impeded intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.

The attached report covers the period from November 1, 2020 – October 31, 2021.

The Board of Regents continue to lead the way on intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas, taking a firm position to combat issues causing much controversy and division in higher education across the nation. While the full text of the Board's Statement and Action Plan can be found at the onset of the report, it can be summarized as an unbridled commitment to: (1) provide enhanced opportunity for all students; (2) proudly support the United States of America and our system of free enterprise and individual liberties upon which our democratic republic was founded; (3) safeguard the rich tradition of American universities and the principles of free speech,

scientific discovery, and academic freedom upon which it was built; and (4) offer a curriculum based upon widely-held and accepted knowledge and thought. These core principles will serve as the foundation upon which our universities will operate as they work to prepare our students for informed and responsible citizenry.

Annual Report on Intellectual Diversity and Free Exchange of Ideas

(November 1, 2020 – October 31, 2021)

(1) Actions taken by each institution to promote and ensure intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.

The following actions impacted each of **BHSU, DSU, NSU, SDSM&T, SDSU** and **USD**:

- At the Board of Regent's [August 2021](#) meeting it approved the following statement and action plan, intended to ensure each of its institutions remains committed to: (1) enhancing opportunities for all students; (2) proudly supporting the United States of America and our system of free enterprise and individual liberties upon which our democratic republic was founded; (3) safeguarding the rich tradition of American universities and the principles of free speech, scientific discovery, and academic freedom upon which it was built; and (4) offering curriculum that is based on widely-held and accepted knowledge and thought.

The South Dakota Board of Regents hereby states that:

1. South Dakota's state universities offer **opportunity for all students**, to benefit from education and to prepare to live and work in South Dakota, or anywhere in the world. We do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, ethnicity, religion, disability, veteran status, economic status, or sexual preference. We treat each person as an individual, not as a member of a group, and offer services and supports for each person's individual situation. We reject, and will not promote, the idea that any individual person is responsible for actions taken by other people. We also reject, and will not promote, any suggestion that one group of people is inherently superior or inferior to another group, or is inherently oppressive or immoral.
2. South Dakota's state universities are public, taxpayer-funded institutions. It is inherent in the missions of our universities to **proudly support the United States of America**. Our students will learn about America's history, our system of individual liberty in a democratic republic, and our system of free enterprise. Part of that instruction is to acknowledge and discuss America's flaws and mistakes, so that we can learn from them and improve. We celebrate, though, America's role in recent world history, as the nation most responsible for expanding liberty, prosperity, and equality across the globe.
3. South Dakota's state universities are a part of **the rich tradition of American universities**, which are built upon free speech, scientific discovery, and academic freedom, and for that reason have been emulated by the rest of the world. We commit our state universities to a focus on the future: preparing the leaders and scholars of the next generation to solve the problems of tomorrow. Although we

can learn from and understand the past, we do this so we can learn to be better in the future, and we will never compel any person to accept any particular set of beliefs.

4. South Dakota's state universities **will offer a curriculum that is based upon widely-held and accepted knowledge and thought.** Our universities will respect academic freedom, and will expect faculty to exercise that freedom in a way that respects this expectation. As our students expand their understanding in a field of study, we encourage that students be exposed to a variety of viewpoints, ideas, and theories, so that they can be debated and critiqued. This could include discredited or controversial ideas, because understanding the weaknesses of failed ideas is as important as understanding the strengths of successful ones. Students must be prepared to identify the good and bad in new or controversial areas of thought.

Action Plan:

Objective: Provide increased opportunity for all students to succeed.

Charge: Bolster student success through the implementation of "Opportunity Centers" on campus. Opportunity Centers should realign and focus campus resources to effectively assess and address the individual needs of all students. Opportunity Centers should serve as an inclusive community where all are welcome, accepted and provided access to the services needed to assist, accommodate, retain and graduate, with equal regard given to the unique challenges and needs of every student. Opportunity Centers should supplement or enhance related activities on campus specific to opportunities or challenges of cultural relevance to South Dakota.

Timeline: The Opportunity Center structure will be in place on each campus by January 1, 2022. Institutions will report their progress on this effort at the Board's October meeting.

Objective: Advance the rich tradition of American public universities, built upon free speech, scientific discovery and academic freedom.

Charge: Safeguard the fundamental principles which have made public higher education in America the standard to which others aspire by ensuring our policies and practices promote and protect the rights of students and faculty alike. The end product(s) should provide clear guidance and/or parameters, while balancing the Constitutional rights of our students and employees with the necessary discretion of the institution to manage its operations and exercise control over that which it commissions.

Timeline: Immediate and ongoing.

Objective: Enhance preparation of students for informed and responsible citizenry in our democratic republic.

Charge: Add, supplement and/or improve programming and training enhancing knowledge of American government and the principles upon which our country was founded; increasing civic engagement; and promoting and developing skills in communication, critical thinking, civility and dispute resolution among individuals with diverse backgrounds, beliefs and perspectives.

Timeline: Immediate and ongoing, with each institution implementing some level of training or programming in the spring 2022 semester.

Objective: Promote equal opportunity and non-discrimination for all through merit-based assessment and decision making.

Charge: Supplement, revise and/or discontinue, as appropriate, any processes, procedures, standards, expectations, etc. necessary to promote a clear message of equality and merit-based decision making and/or assessment, ensuring that, whether directly or indirectly, preferential or adverse treatment on the basis of one's identity or belief system is not occurring.

Timelines: Immediate and ongoing.

- At the Board's [October 2021](#) meeting it approved the first reading of proposed changes to BOR Policies 1:11, 3:9 (new 1:34) and 3:18, all of which serve to further bolster and protect the free exchange of ideas on its campuses.
- The universities compiled a list of speakers on campus, which is set forth in Attachment I.

In addition to the foregoing, the following actions were taken by the respective campuses.

BHSU

- A comprehensive [BHSU Policy and Procedure web site](#) is active with many policies added and more underway. Of relevance to intellectual diversity:

- **Lighthouse Services Subscription for Anonymous Reporting**
Black Hills State University has a partnership with Lighthouse Services, Inc. to provide an [anonymous ethics and compliance hotline](#) for reporting possible ethics and Title IX violations. During the 2020-2021 year, no ethics or Title IX reports were filed.

- **National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE)**
 BHSU administered this survey to first year and senior students in the spring of 2020 and received our response report last fall. Questions related to intellectual diversity were included in the questions.
 - When asked, “During the current school year, about how often have you included diverse perspectives (political, religious, racial/ethnic, gender, etc.) in course discussions or assignments?”, 49% of first year and 48% of senior level students responded: “often” or “very often.”
 - In response to the question asking how often they “tried to better understand someone else’s views by imagining how an issue looks from their perspective?”, 64% of first year and 71% of senior level students responded “often” or “very often.”
 - When asked, “During the current school year, about how often have you had discussions with people from the following groups: people with religious beliefs other than your own?”, 62% of first year students and 64% of senior level students responded “often” or “very often.”
 - In response to the same prompt about “People with political views other than your own?”, 64% of first year students and 68% of senior level students responded “often” or “very often.”
 - When asked “To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statements? I feel comfortable being myself at this institution.”, 88% of first year and 89% of senior level students responded either “agree” or “strongly agree.”
- **Civic Education and Engagement**
 - National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement (NSLVE) participating campus. NSLVE data is used to track student voter participation.
 - BHSU is an Institutional Member of AASCU’s American Democracy Project: A key initiative for membership institutions is the [Voter Education and Engagement](#) initiative. This initiative focuses on comprehensive strategies to ensure that all areas are actively working to increase informed political engagement of our students. According to the [National Study of Learning, Voting, and Engagement report](#), American Democracy Project (ADP) campuses have the highest voter turnout rates of all higher education. As a comparison, the national voter turnout rate for youth 18–29 was 46% and the national average for undergraduate students was 50.7%. ADP campuses had a voter turnout rate of at least 52%.
 - All In Campus Democracy Challenge. BHSU is the only SD institution participating in this program. Participation requires convening a campus working group and developing a campus action plan to improve civic learning and voter participation. The BHSU Student Senate championed the development of our campus civic engagement plan.
 - BHSU students organized a voter-registration drive the week of September 27 through October 1. South Dakota Secretary of State Steve Barnett was on campus on September 28 and worked with the Student Senate as part of the voter registration activities.

- BHSU was named to the “[Best Colleges for Student Voting Honor Roll](#)” by Washington Monthly Magazine in September 2021.
- The Political Science Department organized an essay contest to celebrate Constitution Day (September 17, 2021). Students were invited to submit an essay either explaining why they thought the Constitution should be amended or an essay defending the Constitution from its critics.
- BHSU is developing the Chiesman Civic Speaker Series which will bring speakers related to local, state, and national civic education to campus. This series builds off of a past effort, supported by the BHSU Chiesman Committee, that organized various talks on the First Amendment, the history of Teddy Roosevelt, and the US Constitution.
- SD Legislative Internship Program: three BHSU students were selected to serve as interns for the 2021 legislative session.
- A new colloquium, HON 303 Gerrymandering and Redistricting, was offered in the fall of 2020 to university honors students. This course focused on the history of gerrymandering in our country including in-depth analysis of Supreme Court case law. Students also tried their hand at producing their own South Dakota legislative maps.
- **External Ranking and First Amendment Rights**
 - We monitor our BHSU ranking with the [FIRE](#) organization (Foundation for Individual Rights in Education).
 - [BHSU guide to First Amendment Rights On Campus](#) (presented via this quick link on the BHSU webpage).
- **Events on Campus**
 - BHSU organized and hosted “[The Joy of Learning: A Festival of Talks](#)” June 14-17. These one-hour sessions were open to the community and taught by BHSU faculty. Topic ranged from the geology of the Black Hills to an introduction to opera. A number of sessions were directly related to civic education/engagement:
 - “Does History Repeat Itself?” explored two historians who described how societies rise and fall.
 - “Will My Vote Count?” Parts I and II focused on redistricting efforts following the 2020 census.
 - “Tasting Memory: A History of South Dakota Food” highlighted South Dakota settlement history by focusing on regional food specialties.
 - “A History of Women in Flight” explored how women grappled with both cultural assumptions and unwieldy machines/weather in the early years of aviation.
 - “Lakota Art” discussed Lakota visual art with a focus on materials and traditions.
 - “Born in the USDA: Why We Need Sociology and the Sociological Imagination in the 21st Century” explains how sociology is as American as blue jeans, baseball, and Bruce Springsteen.
 - “Reagan vs. Carter: Views of Purpose and Decline” focused on that window of time between Carter’s “Crisis of Confidence” speech and Ronald Reagan’s

announcement of his candidacy for president.

- “Water Management and Cultural Loss: the Pick-Sloan Missouri Basin Program” discussed the benefits (flood control, irrigation, power generation, and recreational opportunities) as well as the cultural costs of this program.
- Students from ELED 361 met with Representative Dusty Johnson and Katie Murray (Rapid City Field Office) to ask question about his role representing SD in the US House of Representatives in March of 2021.
- American Indian Awareness Week, April 7-16. BHSU hosted seven speakers throughout the week. They discussed various dances and regalia. The week ended with a demonstration via Zoom.
- Jullianne Morris, a photojournalist and media director for the Army National Guard, was invited to speak to photojournalism students in April 2021.
- Brendyn Medina, a public relations specialist with the Rapid City Police Department, was invited to speak to students about “Images and Texts and the Police and their Publics,” in April 2021.
- Dr. Allyson Hobbes, in conjunction with the SD Festival of Books, gave a guest lecture to a GEOL 210 class on racial passing, the great migration, and the cultural mosaic in the United States in October 2021.
- Faculty from the School of Business invited a number of local, national, and international speakers into their classrooms. A sample of speakers include Michael Stone, VP of Bernstein Global Wealth Management, John Shen, CEO of Sunstone Management (Greater China), Andrew Clarke, Tidemann Funds (Singapore), and Emily Aman, Digital Marketing Specialist at BH Energy.
- BHSU hosted “What’s the Buzz”, a campus and community forum to hear from state and local leaders. On August 19 Paulette Davidson, CEO of Monument Health, provided the program and Dana Dykhouse, CEO, First Premier Bank in Sioux Falls, joined us on September 23rd.
- Numerous additional events have been held on campus that support our commitment to intellectual diversity. Please see attached spreadsheet for a list of additional events/speakers.

DSU

- Center for Inclusive Excellence in Learning (DSU Opportunity Center) – Designed to focus energy on the guidance and encouragement of all students as they work to attain their academic, personal, and career goals, and to provide an environment that contributes to a student’s immediate and continued success. THE CENTER will be a place where people matter; where everyone can find belonging and opportunity. Includes the:
 - ✓ Trojan Welcome Center
 - ✓ The Opportunity Zone
 - ✓ The Learning Engagement Center
- Pillar 1 of the new DSU Strategic Plan emphasizes student success with specific elements committed to intellectual diversity:

- ✓ Coordination of Academic Infrastructure Support - new fully-fledged supplementary instruction, tutoring, writing center, and other co-curricular learning strategy that builds on lessons learned during USDoE Title III grant and counselling
 - ✓ Diversification and proliferation of student groups across campus and their integration into campus culture, including campus activities
 - ✓ Development of student mental and physical health services commensurate with a university of DSU's size, student diversity, and wellness needs
 - ✓ Assessment and development of online academic environment, including a virtual student union
- The DSU Master Academic Plan II (2021) calls for two new academic programs that will contribute to intellectual diversity: Human Computer Interaction and a proposed general education course on emerging and disruptive technologies.
- There is an ongoing campus effort to increase the number of women in STEM fields enrolled at DSU. This committee is proposing focused academic recruiting, e.g., education & Teaching, women in cyber, an S-STEM at NSF submission, application for a TRIO Program in STEM, stronger direct marketing, developing a women's soccer team, and produce more scholarship money for female athletes.
- Dr. Kand McQueen presentation on, "Changing Perspectives on Sex, Gender, Humanity, and the World." January 27, 2021.
- Three surveys will be administered through Institutional Research assessing key factors in intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas:
 - ✓ The FSSE (Faculty Survey of Student Engagement)
 - ✓ The NSSE (National Survey of Student Engagement)
 - ✓ The New Student Survey for freshmen and transfer students
- The History and Ethics Forum Committee – Fall 2021 DSU launched a new speaker series, called the Forum on History and Ethics
 - ✓ First Event: October 21, 2021, Professor Bradley J. Birzer, professor of History at Hillsdale College in Michigan. Title: "The Essence of Freedom from the Ancient Greeks to the Founding of the United States."
 - ✓ A minimum of one event per year bringing prominent national thought leaders to Madison, SD to address important topics of the day.
- The Captain's Council -- In athletics, a group of student-athletes (all sports) meets regularly with the goal of enhancing the student-athlete experience at DSU. Recent topics have included race and race relations, mental health, provocative behaviors, e.g., kneeling for the National Anthem.
- ALAST Student Journal at DSU – The goal with this project is to provide an avenue for graduate and undergraduate students engaged in research initiatives at DSU to become familiar with academic peer-review and publishing, to continue to promote and grow research initiatives at DSU, and to provide professional development opportunities for DSU faculty.

- ✓ A demo site is currently up and usable at <http://demo.dsu.bepress.com/alast/>, workflows have been established, and the live site will be launched and ready for content by Thanksgiving 2021.
- Shared Governance Committee -- Dakota State University is adopting the following draft statement of principles underlying shared governance at DSU:
 - ✓ In its simplest form, shared governance is shared decision making based on the principles of partnership, equity, accountability, and ownership at the point of service. Shared governance is a structure and process for partnership, equity, accountability, and ownership. Shared leadership facilitates the decision-making process, information sharing, and transparency.
 - ✓ For the 2021-2022 appointments Shared Governance Committee (faculty, staff and administrators) and the committee has been assigned two pilot projects for this academic year: The DSU Opportunity Center, and the Committee on Committees Task Force report.
 - ✓ If this committee is to have a true role in shared governance, we need a statement about where it will happen and what the operating procedures will be. We will develop an understanding of when this committee gets consulted and brought in as well as the relationship between the shared governance committee and the faculty handbook.
- Promotion of intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas is being promoted in the DSU Cyber Academy efforts. The purpose is to reach out to school districts in South Dakota to expand intellectual discovery and allow interested students to enroll in college LEVEL coursework in Computer and Cyber Sciences. Students who complete the academy (seven courses equaling 21 academic credits) will have completed the 1st (Freshman) year of a four-year university degree program. Students on this stackable credential pathway, will earn badges, certificates, and associates degrees on the way to earning a 4-year bachelor's degree
- Intellectual diversity is supported by the DSU Office of Career and Professional Development in several ways: We purposefully cast a wide net for groups attending our career fair and the university offers many virtual career-related events, e.g., the 2021 Presidential Management Fellows (PMF) Program Information Session, the NSA Diversity Round Table, and RSM Consulting: RSM Hack the Ceiling Networking Series-Diversity in Cybersecurity.
- When the Center for Teaching and Learning conducted Ally training for faculty May 12-13, 2021, the process of maximizing accommodations for online students encouraged faculty to look at alternative resources, tools and applications that would specifically address students various learning disabilities, abilities, and learning styles.
- Dakota State's outreach program CybHER™ has been helping increase gender diversity in cybersecurity since 2013. This initiative has reached over 28,000 children in the last eight years, through events, camps and classroom visits intended to empower, motivate, and educate girls – and boys-- in cybersecurity.

- DSU has participated in the Air Force Junior ROTC cyber academy. DSU was one of five sites across the nation offering a three-credit course in Information Security Fundamentals to JROTC students from around the world. This sub-award was part of a National Science Foundation grant awarded to Whatcom Community College (Bellingham, WA) and the college’s National Cyber Training and Education Center (NCyTE).
- The Foundation for Individual Rights in Education (FIRE) flagged DSU’s 2009 Campus Posting policy (01-91-00) for its appearing to censor student posting content. Action Steps to Encourage Free Speech in Response to FIRE Flag of Policy
 - ✓ DSU’s 2009 Campus Posting policy, through the institutional policy review and development process, was revised to ensure clarity that DSU does not censor posting content.
 - ✓ The revised policy “Campus-Wide Posting 10.1” was sent out for a 30-day campus-wide feedback window on January 13, 2021.
 - ✓ Cabinet approved final policy 10.1 on April 26, 2021.
 - ✓ 10.1 is posted on DSU’s institutional policy web page: <https://dsu.edu/policy/campus-wide-posting.html>
 - ✓ A companion new policy (related to Campus-Wide Posting) for “Facilities and Grounds Use: Freedom, Expression, and Assembly (5.1)” was reviewed in first-draft form by Cabinet on May 25, 2021. It is still in the policy development process.
- In Spring Term 2020, DSU added the BOR-defined cross-curricular skill of diversity to the IDEA end-of-course surveys to obtain information about the degree to which courses helped students improve that skill. DSU continues this practice each semester. Deans and faculty can use the aggregated report data to inform internal college dialogue about student opportunities to learn skills relevant to intellectual diversity (a learning environment that exposes students to and encourages exploration of a variety of ideological and political perspectives).
- Actions in process during this academic year include:
 - ✓ Institutional Policy on the “Facilities and Grounds Use: Freedom, Expression, and Assembly (5.1)” institutional policy. Nate Lukkes strongly encouraged DSU to have one. We tabled the policy with intention to address it again during summer 2021.
 - ✓ HR Onboarding and Exit Surveys. We could add an item to the HR onboarding surveys—1-month out, 6-months, out, exit survey—about the degree to which an employee feels welcome to express his/her ideological and political perspectives in a safe environment.
 - ✓ Cross-Curricular Skill: Diversity, Inclusion, and Equity. We could encourage undergraduate academic programs to select the Cross-Curricular skill of diversity to embed in at least one program PLO with explanation of what actions they will do to embed that learning.
- Academic advising promotes intellectual diversity in that we ask how college experiences inform life after college, we promote self-awareness, advocacy, decision making and

responsibility. Advisors work to bridge the gap between faculty and student. Advisors encourage intellectual diversity by asking students to pursue areas of interest that might be out of their major program requirements.

- Academic Tutoring is offered to all undergraduate students in both virtual and face-to-face settings, in over 120 courses and staffed by peer tutors from various majors on campus. Tutors are trained from the guidelines within the CLRA national certification program, supporting different learning styles, study skills, unconscious bias, Gallup Strengths, and teaching styles. These trainings support Intellectual Diversity.

NSU

- The Center for Public History and Civic Engagement has been under development at Northern for two years. The Center was launched in Fall 2021. The Center will provide guest speakers to address topics in American Government, American History, Civic Engagement, and the U.S. Constitution. The Center provides additional programming for Constitution Day, National History Day, and civic engagement for students, faculty and staff, and community members. The Center also recruits students for the South Dakota State Legislative Internship. Center Director Dr. Jon Schaff is professor of history and studies American political thought and American political development. He is the author of many book chapters, articles, and essays as well as two books: *Abraham Lincoln and the Limits of Liberal Democracy* and *Age of Anxiety: Meaning, Identity, and Politics in 21st Century Literature and Film* (co-authored).
- NSU celebrated the U.S. Constitution on Constitution Day, September 17, 2021.
 - ✓ NSU website to a copy of the Constitution, Constitution Fun Facts, and a Constitution Trivia Game. <https://northern.edu/academics/college-arts-and-sciences/constitution-day>
 - ✓ A CD graphic displayed on NSU TV
 - ✓ A CD graphic displayed on monitors campus-wide (new)
 - ✓ The Dacotah Prairie Museum put-up a display in the Student Center
 - ✓ US Army recruiter put-up a table in the Student Center
 - ✓ 100 pocket Constitutions distributed by SGA leadership in the Student Center (new)
 - ✓ Aramark made red, white & blue cupcakes for the Den at lunch
 - ✓ New laminated CD signs designed by University Relations and posted campus-wide (new)
 - ✓ Senator John Thune and Representative Dusty Johnson made video presentations that played continuously on a monitor in the Student Center (new)
 - ✓ The Exponent will run an article in the next issue
 - ✓ Exchange Club posted several hundred US flags around Aberdeen
 - ✓ Exchange Club lent NSU 6 large US flags and a poster of the Constitution for display in the Student Center
 - ✓ Williams Library made a CD display
 - ✓ The League of Women Voters registered people to vote in the Student Center
 - ✓ Masquers invited to wear Uncle Sam and Lady Liberty outfits on CD (new costumes)

- ✓ 6 NSU faculty staff emailed and thanked for their service and invited to flag retirement ceremony (new)
- ✓ Flag retirement ceremony, with Exchange Club and American Legion, bigger than ever with inclusion of 8 Boy Scouts plus 2 leaders and 2 parents (new)
- ✓ Jon Schaff made a constitution-related presentation at weekly Noon Forum
- ✓ University Communications made a press release and sent photographers to cover the event
- ✓ Multiple offices decorated (e.g., CAS, Graduate Studies, Registrar, etc.)
- ✓ Multiple faculty mentioned CD or worked it into their classroom in some way, like Blanchard in Government and Pulis in Biology
- ✓ Center for Public History and Civic Engagement purchased pocket Constitutions, made available student labor, and director (Schaff) made a presentation (new)
- ✓ Office of the Dean of Students purchased new Lady Liberty and Uncle Sam costumes, encouraged participation through multiple emails, supplied materials (new)
- NSU is committed to safeguarding the fundamental principles of free speech, scientific discovery and academic freedom and protect the rights of students and faculty alike while balancing the Constitutional rights of our students and employees. NSU publishes the Academic Freedom and Responsibility Statement, derived from BOR Policy 1.11, and Freedom of Learning Statement in the University Catalog and includes both in all course syllabi.
 - ✓ Freedom in Learning

Under Board of Regents and University policy, student academic performance must be evaluated solely on an academic basis, not on opinions or conduct in matters unrelated to academic standards. Students should be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any course of study and to reserve judgment about matters of opinion, but they are responsible for learning the content of any course of study for which they are enrolled.
 - ✓ Page 23 of the NSU Student Handbook includes:

STUDENT FREEDOM IN LEARNING

To secure student freedom in learning, faculty members in the classroom and in seminar should encourage free and orderly discussion, inquiry and expression of the course subject matter. Student performance may be evaluated solely on an academic basis, not on opinions or conduct in matters unrelated to academic standards.

 - A. Students should be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any course of study and to reserve judgment about matters of opinion, but they are responsible for learning the content of any course of study for which they are enrolled.
 - B. Each institution shall establish an academic appeals procedure (see Student Academic Grievance Procedure*) to permit review of student allegations that an academic evaluation was tainted by prejudiced or capricious consideration of student opinions or conduct unrelated to academic standards. These procedures shall

prohibit retaliation against persons who initiate appeals or who participate in the review of appeals.

- C. Students are responsible for maintaining standards of academic performance established for each course in which they are enrolled.

- ✓ Page 26 of the Student Handbook outlines the “Student Academic Grievance Procedure.” While students have appealed grades for other reasons and the academic deans and Provost have evidence of students following the “Student Academic Grievance Procedure” and the institution enforcing policies and procedures, the institution has encountered no instances in which student appeals alleged an “academic evaluation was tainted by prejudiced or capricious consideration of student opinions.”

- ✓ Academic Freedom
The freedom of faculty to teach the knowledge encompassed by their academic disciplines is vital to successful education and thus must be defended. Under Board of Regents Policy 1:11, “Academic freedom in its teaching aspect is fundamental for the protection of the rights of the teacher in teaching and of students to freedom in learning. It includes the freedom to perform one’s professional duties and to present differing and sometimes controversial points of view, free from reprisal.”

Guarantees of academic freedom for faculty are included in the BOR Policy 1.11 and the NSU Faculty Handbook. The NSU Academic Affairs office has no record of any complaint for academic freedom violations.

- South Dakota School of Mines and Technology celebrated U.S. Constitution Day on September 17, 2021. Specific events included:
 - ✓ A video telling the origins of the Constitution in lower Surbeck;
 - ✓ Students, faculty, and staff could visit the Surbeck Information desk for a free pocket constitution;
 - ✓ Students could compete in a constitution quiz to win a pair of movie tickets;
 - ✓ Voter registration information was posted around Surbeck and the digital screens;
 - ✓ We included information about the Library of Congress 2020 Constitution and Citizenship Day Event.
 - ✓ South Dakota Mines hosted Mr. Pat West, special assistant attorney general with the South Dakota Division of Criminal Investigation. Mr. West spoke about the impact of the 4th and 5th amendments within law enforcement.
- South Dakota Mines continues to require all faculty to publish a “Freedom in Learning” statement on each course syllabus. The statement is:

“Under Board of Regents and University policy, student academic performance may be evaluated solely on an academic basis, not on opinions or conduct in matters unrelated to academic standards. Students should be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any course of study and to reserve judgement about matters of opinion, but they are responsible for learning the content of any course of study for which they are enrolled. Students who believe that an academic evaluation reflects prejudiced or

capricious consideration of student opinions or conduct unrelated to academic standards should contact the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at provost@sdsmt.edu to initiate a review of the evaluation.”

We created the provost@sdsmt.edu email address this past year so student complaints regarding freedom in learning would come directly to the Provost’s Office.

- We continue to improve the methods in which students, faculty, and staff can report complaints or file a grievance. We are currently working to develop a better system using Advocate, which is also used to report and track student academic integrity and student conduct complaints.
- A new NSF funded initiative to increase the enrollment of first-generation students has begun. The grant provides scholarships to first-generation students. We also link those incoming students with mentors who are also first-generation.
- The **Mines Advantage** program includes a “Cultural and Global Inclusion” component with a learning outcome that students develop effective interactions with people of different backgrounds, along with the demonstration of an understanding and appreciation of human differences.
- We continue to administer several surveys to students to measure overall satisfaction and engagement. This past year, all students took the Student Satisfaction Inventory (SSI). The SSI included several questions related to Campus Climate, Freedom of Expression, and channels for expressing concerns and complaints. None of these items were flagged in the most recent survey. Freshman took both the College Student Inventory (CSI) and the Mid-Year Student Assessment (MYSA). Sophomores took the Second Year Student Assessment (SYSA). Results are provided to all academic departments and administrative offices. These surveys are administered through Ruffalo Noel Levitz. Individual strategies to address concerns are developed at the department level and are tied to the “continuous improvement” strategies of our accrediting bodies.
- Discussions regarding Intellectual diversity continue to be included in our freshman orientation sessions. These discussions include the description of freedom of expression and the need to include and accept varying perspectives.

- **Review of Policies: New or Revised University Policies**

SDSU's Office of General Counsel continues to review policies and procedures at SDSU to ensure alignment with all SDBOR Policies and applicable SD and federal laws. Policies are vetted through our shared governance structure and with the campus community prior to their adoption.

- **Summary of Campus Climate Assessment**

The University is committed to administering the Skyfactor Campus Climate, Safety, and Sexual Assault Assessment every two years to university employees and currently enrolled students. The assessment measures 15 dimensions of faculty, staff, and students' perceptions and satisfaction with the institution. SDSU has administered the Campus Climate survey in 2017, 2019, and 2020. The next administration is scheduled for spring 2022. While proprietary information cannot be publicly available, annual summary reports are shared with the campus.

- **Complaint Reporting Practices**

SDSU has validated that it maintains reporting protocols for a variety of situations, depending on the concern raised. In addition, the process for investigation varies based upon employment relationship, conduct reported, and student status. Beginning in fall 2019, SDSU added "First Amendment/Intellectual Diversity" as a report/complaint category in its online reporting portal, Lighthouse, in which reports may be submitted anonymously.

The Rabbit Report is a weekly student publication sent to all students while classes are in session via the SDSU Students' Association. The Rabbit Report includes a reporting section with links to reporting procedures for a variety of concerns, including anonymous reporting options. In addition, the HR Newsletter sent electronically to all SDSU employees includes information on how to report concerns, including anonymous reporting options. - **Speakers and Events**

Speakers:

Currently, SDSU promotes student organization speakers and events through [Jacks Club Hub](#), an online tool designed for student organizations to promote their organization and their programming. In addition, events are promoted through an intranet portal, InsideState, to all SDSU employees.

South Dakota State University submits its speaker list to the Board of Regents monthly.

- **Training Sessions for University Employees and Students**

The SDSU Office of General Counsel provided training sessions regarding the First Amendment and intellectual diversity to at least 200 individuals in the campus community between November 1, 2020 to October 31, 2021. A list of completed training sessions, as well as the approximate number of attendees for each session, is included in this section. The SDSU Office of General Counsel has maintained a link to a pre-recorded training presentation regarding the First Amendment on SDSU's business portal, InsideState. There were 155 views of the training presentation through InsideState during the reporting period. Mandatory bystander training was also provided to freshmen students as part of campus onboarding, and students were informed of how to report concerns on a wide variety of topics. Additional sessions are scheduled for the future.

Additionally, SDSU made training available for new students entering the University, excluding dual credit students, titled "Diversity Awareness Training" through our existing SDBOR contract with Vector Solutions for online training resources. The training was communicated to new students along with training on the following topics: Title IX, COVID-19, and Alcohol and Other Drugs. Diversity is a core value at SDSU and this training provides students with an awareness of how a diverse student body, as well as diverse faculty and staff members, strengthen our campus and the educational opportunities at SDSU. The training focuses on a broad definition of diversity beginning with an introduction to the SDSU Core Values. This training takes students approximately 20 minutes to complete and introduces them to the value of interacting with and learning from individuals with differing viewpoints, backgrounds, and beliefs and goes beyond the typical categories of diversity such as race and gender. Included in the resources section of this training is the SDBOR Commitment to Freedom of Expression policy as well as links to other applicable policies and how to report concerns.

- **Academic and Other Activities**

Course syllabi are required by SDSU Course Syllabus Policy 2:3 to have the following statement included, and this was communicated during this period:

Freedom in Learning Statement: Students are responsible for learning the content of any course of study in which they are enrolled. Under Board of Regents and University policy, student academic performance shall be evaluated solely on an academic basis and students should be free to take reasoned exception to the data or views offered in any courses of study. Students who believe that an academic

evaluation is unrelated to academic standards but is related instead to judgment of their personal opinion or conduct should first contact the instructor of the course. If the student remains unsatisfied, the student may contact the Department Head, Dean, or both, of the college which offers the class to initiate a review of the evaluation.

SDSU validated that it offers the System General Education Requirements (SGRs) courses in communication, mathematics, and sciences. There is an array of elective courses within the requirements for Social Sciences and Arts and Humanities, which provide an awareness of the histories and psycho-social, economic, and political structures, as well as an understanding of the contributions of diverse cultures. Course offerings to meet the Social Sciences elective include, but are not limited to, American Indian Studies, Anthropology, Human Geography, United States History, American Government, American Political Issues, Political Ideologies, State and Local Government, and Sociology of Rural America. Course offerings to meet the Arts and Humanities elective include, but are not limited to, American Indian Studies, World Civilization, Western Civilization, and Lakota.

USD

- Due the COVID-19 pandemic, USD's speakers were dramatically reduced. Academic departments continued to bring in speakers germane to the discipline and can be found on the attached speaker report.
- The Political Science and History departments along with the Cheisman Center for Democracy, is in the process of scheduling a three-part speaker series in the Spring 2022 semester. This series is based on research completed by the Cheisman Center and will discuss the modern political landscape from the 1970's to present.
- At the direction of the Board of Regents, USD is in the midst of implementing an Opportunity Center. USD will provide increased opportunity for all students to succeed with the USD Opportunity Center, which will create a central connecting point for student success resources, centralize student leadership development opportunities and ensure campus discussion and dialogue is intentional, robust and varied. The Opportunity Center will be a physical office housed in the Muenster University Center that supplements the virtual connecting point that already exists for USD faculty, staff and students in the form of the Coyote One Stop knowledge base.
- ✓ As part of its efforts to broaden student support services and align efforts with other SDBOR institutions, USD will establish an Office of Multicultural Affairs within the Student Services arm of the Opportunity Center. This office will have a designated administrator. The former CDC space will be home to Multicultural Affairs and will also become a collaborative space for all student organizations at USD to work both individually and collectively, with the goal of learning from each other in meaningful ways. The reconfigured space will also have one office set aside to bring student services from across campus directly to students on a rotating basis. A regular rotation will include staff from Disability Services, Student Veterans Services,

Academic & Career Planning, Financial Aid, Registrar, University Housing, Student Counseling Center, and other offices as deemed necessary.

- ✓ Serving as an umbrella organization for the array of student support services, offices and efforts already underway on campus, the Opportunity Center will coordinate resources to ensure each student has access to what they need to succeed at USD. While reporting structures will not change, the director of the Opportunity Center will work collaboratively with each area to ensure students have access to a one-stop-shop that can address any need. To better provide all students with consistent and holistic support, the Opportunity Center director will also develop training for new and existing faculty and staff members on resources available to students. Additionally, the director will oversee and implement an expanded President's Leadership Institute, including a Learning to Lead program aimed at first-year students, an Emerging Leaders program designed for second- and third-year students, and a President's Senior Leadership Institute designed for fourth-year students. This will not only significantly increase the number of students who receive leadership training but will also provide a greater degree of training to those who seek it. The Opportunity Center will also expand USD's current career services efforts to include a deliberate partnership with the USD Alumni Association to match students with alumni mentors and provide oversight for the new Coyote Careers Kickstart Program.
- ✓ USD will utilize the Opportunity Center to coordinate institutional efforts to advance the rich tradition of American public universities, built upon free speech, scientific discovery and academic freedom. The center will become a focal point for USD's ongoing efforts to present a wide variety of campus speakers offering multiple perspectives on topics of interest. The Opportunity Center will maintain a master schedule of all campus discussions. It will also serve as a resource for the rest of campus to assist in arranging and identifying speakers who can provide perspectives on current or emerging topics and keep an inventory of who is speaking on campus in real time. Finally, the Opportunity Center will also serve as a campus resource on USD and SDBOR free speech policies and facility use procedures. It will play a direct role in making annual presentations on free speech content at freshman orientation and to student organizations.
- ✓ As the state's comprehensive public liberal arts institution, USD is well-positioned to enhance the preparation of students for informed and responsible citizenry in our democratic republic. The university has a long history of offering civic-minded programming, including Constitution Day events, moderated political forums, campus speakers representing the entire political spectrum, and opportunities for civic and political engagement. The university also has a commendable record of offering academic majors and minors in history, political science, classical humanities and civic leadership, all of which include relevant course content and student experiences. As part of the Opportunity for All framework, the Opportunity Center will coordinate a new USD History, Civics & the Law Lecture Series with the Office of Academic Affairs. Incentives will be created to encourage academic departments to add additional events to the lecture series. The Opportunity Center and the Office of

Academic Affairs will also work with the W.O. Farber Center for Civic Leadership and the Chiesman Center for Democracy to identify additional civic-minded programming to enhance the campus experience.

- ✓ USD will also use the Opportunity for All framework to promote equal opportunity and non-discrimination for all through merit-based assessment and decision making to ensure that, whether directly or indirectly, preferential or adverse treatment based on one's identity or belief system is not occurring. One effort already underway is a review of the campus-level Expectations of the Faculty document that applies to faculty in the College of Arts & Sciences, Beacom School of Business, School of Education, College of Fine Arts and University Libraries. The review will be conducted by the Office of Academic Affairs and the relevant deans this fall, and an updated campus-level document will be distributed later this fall or early spring to academic departments who will in turn revise their corresponding unit-level documents. Per Board of Regents policy, documents that are revised during this process will go into effect during the 2022-2023 academic year. A review of faculty expectations for Health Affairs and the School of Law will also take place this academic year. In addition to the Expectations of the Faculty document, all policy, procedure and guidance documents used for employee evaluation and workload assignment must be consistent with the SDBOR charge.
- ✓ The Opportunity Center will also play a role in enhancing merit-based assessment and decision making in two specific ways. First, the Opportunity Center will work with Human Resources to develop and conduct search committee trainings for all campus offices. This will ensure that administrators, faculty and staff are following uniform procedures for creating the most broadly representative hiring pools possible and then identifying the most qualified candidates from within those hiring pools. Second, the director will serve on a campus advisory group that will review the existing charges for the university diversity committees and will then work with the president's leadership team to identify and implement amended charges to those committees so they support all students, faculty and staff.

- One faculty member remarked that Regent actions removing peer review from the grievance process and actions reducing faculty rights in policy 4.7 are occurrences that have impeded intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.
- During the report period DSU received two complaints from students about class-related events that, in the words of the student, impeded intellectual diversity and the free exchange of ideas.

SDSU

- Student sent an email sent to the Office of University Housing and Residential Life, titled *“Inclusive campus environment”* stating, *“As I walk to class every day, I see these flags in the window of Spencer Hall on the second floor. It makes me wonder what kind of impression high schoolers and their families get as they see the F word and an offensive depiction of a celebrity figure in a heavy foot traffic area. I also think it is disrespectful to the American Indian Student Center to have a person that has offended them facing their building with middle fingers up. No matter their political opinion this is offensive and vulgar to many other students. I and others would appreciate having these offensive signs taken down and making sure more do not take their place in other areas.”* (October 5, 2021)
- Student sent an email and reported to the Title IX/EO Office that 2 faculty and 1 staff member *“...are trying to silence my voice. They are in infringement of my constitutional rights by suppressing free speech in a way that has a chilling and detrimental effect. They do not want my voice to be heard...”* (July 20, 2021)
- Student sent an email to the Title IX/EO Office stating, *“I would like to issue a complaint about [Course Name] ...I believe this class violates South Dakota intellectual diversity standards and it probably infringed on my free speech rights. This course contained explicitly ideological readings, which were featured as its core texts. Our instructor often referred to them as "theoretical texts". These documents were not academic studies, they were manifestos of post-modernist thinking and neo-Marxist existentialism. As we covered a verity of topics throughout the course, we were essentially required to agree with the ideas contained in the core texts as we covered each topic. Furthermore, the topics we covered were covered in a slanted way, and typically only expored [sic] one point of view of major societal issues. We were taught to agree with specific political positions several times, including immigration policy, national security issues, race-reparations, and police reform...”* (April 30, 2021)
