



Workforce

- 116.4 full-time equivalent (FTE) employees
- Nearly all employees are permanent positions
- 3 Divisions
 - Adjutant General's Office (5.3 FTE)
 - Army Guard (63.1 FTE)
 - Air Guard (48.0 FTE)
- In FY23 84% state employee salaries were covered by federal funds
- Unutilized FTE past two Fiscal Years: None
- Overtime Usage: <u>Fire Fighters</u>
- Retention: 93%
- Long-Term Vacancies: <u>Sioux Falls Firefighter & Engineer II</u>
- Approaching Retirement Age:
 - 12 Eligible Today
 - 32 Eligible Within 5-Years
 - 49 Eligible within 10- Years

Governor's FY2026 Budget Recommendation



BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2026 budget recommendation seeks a decrease of \$1,086,283 in general funds, a decrease of \$2,444,063 in federal fund authority.

The over \$1M general funds reduction equates to 13% of our budget.

This includes:

- A <u>decrease</u> of \$593,302 of general funds and \$2,462,921 of federal funds in Maintenance & Repair for a total of \$3,056,223
- An <u>increase</u> in utilities of \$17,042 in general funds and \$18,858 in federal funds for a total of \$35,900
- A <u>decrease</u> in general funds of \$450,000 in State tuition assistance
- A <u>decrease</u> in general funds of \$60,023 in Civil Air Patrol supplement

- Civil Air Patrol

 - Total removal of the grant; significant operational and programmatic consequences
- National Guard Tuition Assistance Program
 - **–** (\$450,000)
 - Transfer from BOR; right-sizing the allocation to match utilization
- Maintenance and Repair
 - (\$593,302 GF & \$2,462,921 Fed)
 - Delaying projects, little short term impact provided future years are more robust


