Fall 2024 Degree-Seeking Students

- 70% SD Residents
- 42% First-Generation (first in family to attend)
- 34% Pell-Eligible (low income)

Number of FY23 Graduates Employed in SD

• Associate: 90.9%

• Bachelor's: 76.3%

Master's: 90.0%

Freedom Scholarships to Most In Need

- 90% to Pell-Eligible (low income)
- 10% assist those just above Pell-Eligibility
- 235 unique NSU students awarded

• First-Time UG Students 358 +20%

• Grad degree-seeking 244 +15%

• Full-Time Equiv Students 1,838 +9.5%

• Total Credit Hours 27,080 +9%

Retention First-Year Increased by 9% since FY21





Innovating to Meet Workforce Needs

- SD 3rd highest projected shortfall of Registered Nurses
- Presentation College had provided 40-60% of area new hires
- SD Board of Nursing has approved prerequisite status
- Hired expert and experienced Associate Dean and Faculty
- First cohort begins Fall 2025
- Secured private support of \$4M for startup and \$1.7M for scholarships





Collaborating to Meet Workforce Needs

NSU + Southeast Technical College Co-Admission Pathway

- STC Business Associate includes 1 NSU course per semester
- All credits directly transfer to any NSU's Bachelor's in Business

Bachelor of Agricultural Business

- Brown County 2nd in State with \$2.77B Ag/Forestry Output
- Degree includes 4 SDSU agricultural economics courses

SD Secondary Teacher Apprenticeship Pathway

- 10th registered program in the nation
- Finalizing agreement to provide to State of Delaware

Completion: December 2025






Gerber Hall Renovation

\$5M Renovation - Millicent Atkins School of Education

- \$2.5M M&R Appropriation
- \$2.5M HEFF and General Fund M&R Match
- 4 Modern Classrooms and Social Learning Spaces
- Enhanced Accessibility and New Elevator
- Updated Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing
- Completion: April 2025


Proposed M&R reduction impact = \$1.23 million annually





Center for Statewide E-Learning Update


- Governor Janklow solution to teacher shortages (2001)
- Master Teachers deliver High School content courses
- Priority registration is based on DOE sparsity rankings
- Mathematics for College Readiness added in 2023
 Success allows enrollment to credit-bearing math courses at SD public universities
- NSU, BIT-DDN, DOE, and K-12 Data Center collaborating on alternative DDN Solution for F2025





Efficiencies

- Optimize course section enrollments and adjust staffing accordingly
- Increased housing utilization by 20.7% (growth, renovation, demolition)
- NSU provides HR and IT services to SDSBVI
- \$200K in utility savings through facility upgrades
