AMENDMENT 1169C FOR THE HOUSE STATE AFFAIRS ENGROSSED BILL

An Act to modify the signature requirement for a petition to initiate a constitutional amendment.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 2-1-1 be AMENDED:

2-1-1. <u>All measures A measure proposed by initiative shall may be presented only</u>
by a petition. <u>The petition shall be signed by not less than at least</u> five percent of the
qualified electors of the state.

8 An amendment to the South Dakota Constitution proposed by initiative may be 9 presented only by a petition signed by qualified voters from each senatorial district, equal 10 in number to at least five percent of the total votes cast for Governor in the senatorial 11 district at the last gubernatorial election, provided that the total number of signatures on 12 the petition equals at least ten percent of the total votes cast for Governor in the last 13 gubernatorial election.

14 Section 2. That § 2-1-1.1 be AMENDED:

2-1-1.1. A petition sponsor shall file, in a physical and electronic format, a petition 15 16 for an initiated amendment to the South Dakota Constitution, as it is to be circulated-for 17 an initiated amendment to the Constitution must be filed, with the secretary of state, 18 including an electronic copy of the petition, prior to circulation for signatures before the 19 petition may be circulated and at least one year before the next general election at which 20 the initiated amendment to the constitution is proposed to be submitted to the voters. 21 The petition filing must: 22 Contain the full text of the initiated amendment in fourteen-point font; (1)

23 (2) <u>Contain Designate</u> the date of the general election at which the initiated
 24 amendment is to be submitted;

(3) Contain the title and explanation as prepared by the attorney general;

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(4) Be accompanied by a notarized affidavit form signed by each person who is a petition sponsor that includes the name and address of each petition sponsor; and
 (5) Be accompanied by a statement of organization as provided in § 12-27-6.

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Each petition circulator shall provide to each-person_individual who signs the 4 5 petition a circulator handout containing the title and explanation of the initiated amendment to the Constitution as prepared by the attorney general; any fiscal note 6 7 prepared pursuant to § 2-9-30; the name, phone number, and email address of each petition sponsor; and a statement indicating whether the petition circulator is a volunteer 8 or paid circulator and, if a paid circulator, the amount the circulator is being paid. The 9 secretary of state shall must approve the circulator handout for each initiated amendment 10 to the Constitution before the petition is circulated. 11

12 For any initiated amendment petition, no signature may be obtained A petition for 13 an initiated amendment to the constitution may not be circulated more than twenty-four months-preceding before the general election that was designated at the time of filing of 14 the full text pursuant to subdivision (1). Each sheet of the petition must indicate the 15 senatorial district where the signatures were collected and may contain only signatures 16 from that senatorial district. A sworn affidavit, signed by at least two-thirds of the petition 17 sponsors, stating that the documents filed constitute the entire petition and to the best of 18 the knowledge of the sponsors contains a sufficient number of signatures, must also be 19 20 filed with the secretary of state. The initiated amendment petition signatures must be filed with the secretary of state by the first Tuesday in May of a general election year for the 21 22 initiated amendment to qualify for submission to the voters at the next general election.

The State Board of Elections shall-prescribe_promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter
 <u>1-26, prescribing</u> the form of the affidavit and the requirements of the petition not
 otherwise, including petition size and petition font size for ballot measure language not
 prescribed in this section specified by this section.

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
