AMENDMENT HR7001F FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

1	A RESOLUTION, Impeaching On the potential impeachment of Jason Ravnsborg,
2	Attorney General of the State of South Dakota , for certain crimes or
3	misdemeanors in office.
4	WHEREAS, the Attorney General of the State of South Dakota is a state officer subject to
5	impeachment pursuant to S.D. Const., Art. XVI, § 3; and
6	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives shall have the sole power of impeachment
7	pursuant to S.D. Const., Art. XVI, § 1 ; and :
8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the Ninety-Sixth
9	Legislature of the State of South Dakota, that these Articles of Impeachment are adopted in
10	the name of the People of South Dakota and of the South Dakota House of Representatives
11	against Jason Ravnsborg, Attorney General of the State of South Dakota, in maintenance and
12	support of its impeachment against him for crimes or misdemeanors in office.
13	Article I: Acts Causing the Death of Joseph Boever
14	Article XVI, § 3 of the South Dakota Constitution provides that the House of
15	Representatives may impeach "state and judicial officers," for "drunkenness, crimes, corrupt
16	conduct, or malfeasance or misdemeanors in office." Jason Ravnsborg committed crimes or
17	misdemeanors in office causing the death of Joseph Boever, specifically:

18	(1) On the evening of September 12, 2020, Jason Ravnsborg failed to operate his
19	vehicle within its proper lane, crossed outside such lane, and struck pedestrian and
20	Highmore, South Dakota resident Joseph Boever. Mr. Boever died from injuries
21	sustained from the collision; and
22	(2) Jason Ravnsborg has been charged by the Hyde County State's Attorney with three
23	separate crimes in connection with his driving on the night in question.

The Attorney General having a special obligation to the People and the Laws of the State of South Dakota, Jason Raynsborg must be removed from such office for his crimes or misdemeanors in office causing the death of Joseph Boever. Article II: Other Acts Following the Death of Joseph Boever Article XVI, § 3 of the South Dakota Constitution provides that the House of Representatives may impeach "state and judicial officers," for "drunkenness, crimes, corrupt conduct, or malfeasance or misdemeanors in office." Jason Ravnsborg committed crimes or misdemeanors in office associated with the investigation following the death of Joseph Boever-Following the collision, including during his reporting of the collision and the resulting investigation, Jason Raynsborg undertook actions unbecoming the Attorney General, Jason Ravnsborg's statements and actions failed to meet the standard of the Office of the Attorney General. The Attorney General having a special obligation to the People and the Laws of the State of South Dakota, Jason Ravnsborg must be removed from such office for his crimes or misdemeanors in office following the death of Joseph Boever after a conviction, plea of guilty or nolo contendere, or acquittal in case number 34MAG21-0001, State v. Jason Ravnsborg, the House of Representatives may evaluate whether articles of impeachment against Jason Ravnsborg, Attorney General of the State of South Dakota, are necessary and proceed
